Dear Congregants,

In this month’s bulletin, I will try my hand at sports reporting. I would like to begin by wishing Ryan Braun a mazel tov on winning the MVP (Most Valuable Player) award in Major League Baseball this year. Unfortunately, I will have to begin instead by wishing Braun a mazel tov on the more current news that the BBWAA (Baseball Writers’ Association of America) has announced it will not strip him of the award even if Major League Baseball suspends him for 50 games next year for testing positive for performance enhancing substances during the playoffs.

Let’s begin at the beginning. Braun, the celebrated left fielder of the Milwaukee Brewers, won the award batting .332 with 33 homers and 111 RBIs, as well as stellar defense in the outfield, leading the Brewers to the postseason, where they reached the National League Championship Series before falling to the eventual world champion St. Louis Cardinals. Braun, a self-identified Jew\*, is only the fourth Jew to win the MVP award (after Hank Greenberg, Sandy Koufax, and Al Rosen). Still only 28 and in the prime of his career, Braun can already lay statistical claim to be the third greatest Jewish ballplayer in Major League history, behind only the legendary Greenberg and Koufax. \*(According to public sources, Braun’s father is Jewish, his mother not. This makes him Jewish by birth under the Reform and common Reconstructionist standard, but not so under the traditional halachic standard applied by the rest of the Jewish world. While conversion for a child raised as a Jew is a simple formality, it is not publicly evident whether Braun ever underwent a conversion; and although he proudly considers himself Jewish, he states that he never celebrated a bar mitzvah or observed holidays. Whatever his halachic status, Braun’s public identity is clearly Jewish, and for all the *nachas* we *shepped* over his successes, we must now acknowledge him in times of embarrassment as well.)

According to the information available as I write (though much more may be known by the time you read this), Braun tested positive for a highly elevated level of the male hormone testosterone during last October’s playoffs, following his MVP regular season, which further testing showed to be synthetic (that is, not his body’s own testosterone, even at abnormally high levels). When informed of the finding, Braun immediately requested a re-test, which he passed. Although the test result and the 50-game suspension it would trigger are currently under appeal to an arbitrator and still subject to confidentiality, the news was prematurely leaked. This means, unfortunately for Braun, that while the sports media world is aflame over the scandal, he cannot yet tell his side of the story. His two-letter description of the affair so far is that the finding is “BS,” and his people claim he has a great explanation and the ruling will be overturned. The baseball cognoscenti tell us no such finding has ever been publicly overturned by the arbitrator in the brief history of baseball’s performance-enhancing-drug testing rules, but some add that no accused player has ever before had his results leaked during the appeal process, leaving open the possibility that some cases have been overturned and then successfully kept confidential for the sake of the player’s – and baseball’s – reputation.

Although we have not heard his story yet, my imagination can conjure basically four types of explanations for Braun’s test. From best to worst (for Braun), they are:

1. A false positive – something amiss with the test itself. This might mean bad chemistry was performed in the lab, or perhaps the wrong sample was tested, or the test was poorly designed and unreliable to begin with. Such an outcome would mean Braun did nothing wrong at all. However, this would be something the lawyers and chemists would find upon examining the lab work, and would not depend on Braun telling his story of what happened. This does not seem to be the claim coming from his camp.
2. Braun did not knowingly take any banned substance for performance-enhancing or other purposes. Explanations in this category might include his doctor prescribing a medication with an unexpected side-effect, or some combination of legal supplements producing an unexpected result in concert. Another variation of this would show a valid medical reason for extraordinarily high testosterone, but this would also have to account for the finding that it was synthetic. The weakness of these arguments is that they depend on an assertion that Braun could not reasonably know they would affect his body in this way, but after all, he is an athlete, not a doctor or a chemist.
3. A claim of negligence rather than malicious cheating. This is the most common claim of accused ballplayers. There are many varieties of this argument: he bought the wrong supplement; he took someone else's supplements; he forgot to check the list of banned substances carefully or trusted the wrong person to check for him. Perhaps he forgot to tell the league that he is being treated for an early onset of low testosterone, and they caught him on a day his medication was in flux. With the exception of that last fanciful suggestion, the weakness of these claims is that we must believe the ballplayer just happened to get caught making a one-time mistake. They also admit the athlete was cheating – accidentally. This is an argument for saving a shred of reputation, not for avoiding punishment.
4. He did it. This is pretty clearly not what Braun has to say.

Let me take a moment to address this as a rabbi. Believe it or not, Jewish law and ethics has a category that covers cheating, including cheating in sports. This is called גניבת דעת, *g'nivat da'at*, which could be translated over-literally as stealing knowledge or stealing mind. Of course, the expression means misleading or cheating, but what is important about the form in Hebrew is that it puts cheating not in the category of playful trickery, but of stealing. And a ballplayer who cheats is stealing from many people. He is, of course, stealing opportunity from his fellow athletes who follow the rules. In this case, he may have stolen the MVP award and a piece of history from a more deserving athlete. He is defrauding all those spectators who expect to see a clean sport, but instead see a chemistry contest. Most important, he is stealing from the parents who buy their children his merchandise and point him out to their children as a role model, only to find that he is in fact a model of a cheat; and he is stealing a measure of the innocence of those children.

I hope when all the facts come out, Braun will prove to be innocent. I hope so because he is an appealing star and has always seemed to be a real “good guy” in baseball. I hope so especially because as a Jew in public life, he represents us all – whether we, or he, like that or not. I hope so most of all because so many of his disillusioned fans nationwide are Jewish parents and children for whom a Jewish sports hero is a real source of pride and bonding.

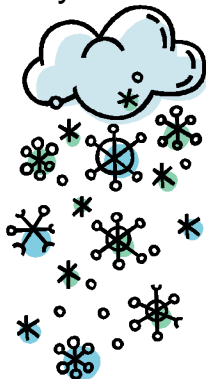

## GUEST COMMENTARY

Dear Members of Synagogue and Temple:

I wish you a very Healthy and Happy New Year!

For more than 20 years, I have felt that because of the demographics of this area, the only way a healthy religious Judaism will survive in Glens Falls is to merge our two congregations. As the years go by, this has become obvious to many members of both congregations with whom I have spoken, and they look with favor on merger.

The problems we face are not unique to us. They are pervasive throughout the country among many different religious groups and different size communities.

I found this quote in the Summer 2009 "Reform Judaism" magazine by Rabbi Eric H Yoffie, URJ President, "In a small town it may be that a struggling Reform and a struggling Conservative Synagogue will have to...join in cooperative programming, and even formal mergers."


The Presidents of both our congregations have been in contact in the past year about discussing the subject of merger but movement has been very slow and superficial so far.

I feel that the only way a successful merger will be brought about is to bring in an experienced facilitator at the right time to be sure our planning and execution of the plan is done properly.
