RABBI'S MESSAGE

The period after the Yammim Norim, the High Holydays, is a transitionary one. We go from intense prayers and supplications to one of our calendar's happiest times, Sukkot. The seven day festival occurs just five days after the most soul searching day, Yom Kippur. Sukkot is known by two other names: Ziman Simachateinu, The days of our joy, and Chag HaAsif, the festival of ingathering.

I prefer the term Ziman Simchateinu, the season of our joy. We have turned ourselves around and made a fresh start through the High Holydays. We need that space, that breath of fresh air as we turn outwardly to nature to dwell in booths for the festival. Sukkot combines the dwelling in booths as a remembrance of the time we wandered in the desert for forty years, with the harvest festival, therefore the name Chag HaAisf.

Coming of the heel of Yom Kippur, Sukkot perhaps loses a bit. But the happiness, the joy of the holiday should overcome this. We take to our backyard or community sukkah and decorate it with seasonal fruits and gourds. It is a happy space. People also decorate it with New Year's cards, drawings, streamers and other personal decorations. The top is covered with sekhakh, a covering which must be left loose, to allow the stars to be seen and allow wind and rain to enter.

Another custom is to invite guests to the sukkah, but not just any guests. These are special people. The custom is known as Ushpizin which means guests in Aramaic. Our guests are Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Aaron, Joseph and David. On each day one of our leaders is the first invited guest, with others in order.

Of course another mitzvah is to invite "regular" guests, too, for meals, and also to perform another commandment, "Shev B'Sukkah," to sit in the sukkah and bentsch (say the blessings) over the lulav and Etrog. The lulav is comprised of the four species found in Israel: The frond of a date palm tree, myrtle, and willow. In addition, we use an Etrog, a citron, for our Sukkot prayers. There are very specific customs regarding the shaking of the lulav and Etrog, both in your sukkah, and during

services at temple. The rules concerning this are found in Leviticus (23:40) and also in the mishnah and other commentators including Rashi.

Believe it or not, there is no commandment to use an Etrog, although this has been the custom for many generations. The Torah requires us to use an Etz Hadar, a special, beautiful fruit. The Etrog was known as a special, beautiful fruit, and its use on Sukkot was started and has continued. Remarkably traces of "essence of Etrog" have been found in archaeological sites dating as far back as Herod, who reigned in Judea from 37 BCE to 4 BCE, over 2,000 years ago!

The celebration of Sukkot is a special time. As noted people invite friends into the sukkah for dinners. Larger congregational or communal sukkot are used for various groups to enjoy the holiday, with events such as Pizza or even Sushi in the Sukkah being popular.

However you celebrate the festival, do something special to make it a Joyous and Memorable time! We need that release after Yom Kippur. Chag Sameach!

As you are probably aware, we have not raised membership dues in many years and strive to welcome all to our synagogue community regardless of financial circumstances. Your generosity, combined with our leadership's fiscal prudence and volunteer efforts have kept us in solid fiscal condition. However, as the investment industry always says, "past performance is no guarantee of future returns." The Yom Kippur appeal can go a long way to making up the difference between what our dues cover and the actual costs of running a vibrant synagogue.

Also, if you feel that Shaaray Tefila is a part of your life and can make a positive impact on Jewish life in our region but have not yet joined, please do so now. What better way is there to put Hillel's advice into practice: "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am for myself only, what am I? If not now, when?"

TASHLICH AT CRANDALL PARK 1st Day Rosh Hashanah Monday, September 10, 2018 At 4:30 PM

What is the purpose of Tashlich?

This custom, which means to "to cast off," is generally performed on the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah unless it falls on a Saturday. Jews go to a stream, river, ocean or lake (it should be a living body of water) and throw bread crumbs into the water as a way of symbolically casting away sins. The tradition is based on a verse from the Book of Micah: "God will take us back in love; God will vanquish our iniquities and cast our sins into the depths of the sea." The Tashlich prayer recited contains these verses and selected chapters from Psalms.

For many Jews, Rosh Hashanah is a time for reciting many words. Through Tashlich, we use our bodies and actions to do the work of return. Although the rabbinic authorities originally objected to this ritual, Jews stubbornly performed it until it became a "traditional" part of the holiday.

SYNAGOGUE NEWS, and ANNOUNCEMENTS

YOM KIPPUR APPEAL

We all have our reasons for being a part of Congregation Shaaray Tefila. It means different things to different people but we all share a responsibility in maintaining a viable Synagogue. Over the past twenty years, we have seen a decrease in membership though the loss of many of our long time members who have passed away or moved out of the area. Recently, we have seen an influx of new members—many of whom are seasonal. How does Congregation Shaaray Tefila survive financially? We have not raised dues in over ten years. We have a current policy of first year membership free for new members. We have many part-time members who pay seasonal dues. We offer reduced dues on a case by case basis. We lost Bingo as a steady stream of income several years ago. We have a few fundraisers during the year such as the Sisterhood Garage Sale, the Holiday Flowers, Onegs and Kiddushes, and some other

functions but they do not come close to covering the loss of income from Bingo. Some functions which used to be revenue neutral, meaning the cost was covered by those attending, are now revenue negative, meaning the Synagogue pays for them without charge to the attendees. Our checking account surplus is now depleted and we will be taking money from our reserves.

Our Yom Kippur Appeal is our biggest fundraiser and we have been fortunate that it often exceeds our goal. It is up to each and every one of us to participate and not sit back and say, "They don't really need my help." Yes we do. We need everyone to participate by sending in your pledges. We no longer to the verbal solicitation of pledges during services so please get your pledges in before the Holidays and we will read them following the President's Message. Financial survival of Congregation Shaaray Tefila ultimately depends on you!

DANCING WITH THE TORAH



Join us to celebrate Simchat Torah with prayer and dancing! Monday, October 1, 2018 and Tuesday, October 2, 2018.

Simchat Torah is the day

on which we read the last part of the Torah and roll it right back to the beginning to read the first part. Like Sukkot, Simchat Torah is a happy time. On Sukkot we're thankful for the harvest which gives us food for our bodies. On Simchat Torah we're thankful for the Torah which gives us food for thought.

The Torah is probably the most important Jewish object there is. We show it lots of honor. We stand when it is taken out or put away. We stand whenever it is held up. We give it the same honor that people would show a king.

On Simchat Torah the congregation dances with the Torah scrolls. All the Torah scrolls are removed from the Aron Kodesh (Holy Ark) and distributed to members of the congregation. One member leads the other Torah-bearing members in a circuit around the Synagogue. The leader leads the congregation in reciting special prayers. When the circuit is completed, the congregation sings and dances until it is time to start the next hakafa (circuit). This is done seven times.
