**RABBI'S REPORT**

**Celebrating Israel**

There are two days that fall next to each other on the calendar and are linked in the hearts and souls of all Israelis and Jews living in the diaspora. Why they are placed next to each other tells volumes about the history of our people, and how events are linked in perpetuity.

On May 8th and 9th this year (or the 4th and 5th of Iyar) we celebrate Yom Ha Zicharon (the Day of Remembrance for fallen soldiers) and Yom Ha Atzma'ut (Independence Day), two of the most important days on the modern Israeli calendar.

On May 14, 1948, David Ben Gurion declared independence and hours later US President Harry Truman recognized the tiny state. But the joy and exhilaration of Independence Day is immediately preceded by the Day of Remembrance. For the nation could never have existed without the bravery of its soldiers, many who died in the fight to establish the state.

One has to remember how many battles there were before that day and immediately after. For even while people were celebrating independence in the streets, many new battles challenged Israel's very existence.

While many around the world do not agree with all of the actions of the current State of Israel, how many agree with all of the actions of the US government? One has to remember the basic, core values of the state, the only democratic nation in the Middle East, and the only homeland for the Jewish people.

Memorial Day is a very somber day in Israel. All public entertainment venues (theaters, cinemas, nightclubs, pubs, etc.) are closed. The sound of a siren is heard throughout the country twice, during which the entire nation observes a two-minute "standstill" of all traffic and daily

activities. Everything stops at that time. Everything. Anyone who has been in Israel on this day attests to its uniqueness. The haunting sounds of the sirens are remembered as the country turns its thoughts to its fallen soldiers.

The first siren marks the beginning of Memorial Day at 8 p.m., and the second is at 11 a.m., before the public recitation of prayers in the military cemeteries. Radio and television stations broadcast programs portraying the lives and heroic deeds of fallen soldiers. Most of the broadcasting time is devoted to Israeli songs that convey the mood of the day.

But then, at sundown, the mood of the country turns from somber to joyous, with the celebration of Independence Day. There is singing and dancing in the streets. The following day many families go for picnics and hikes celebrating the day, many public celebrations occur as Israel celebrates its modern beginnings.

Due to the significance of the two days, many congregations include special prayers and Torah readings. On Yom HaZikaron some add readings about Israel, light a yahrtzeit candle, add a special El Maleh Rachamim (God Full of Compassion) for all the fallen soldiers, and recite a communal Kaddish Yatom (Mourner's Kaddish).

For Independence Day, some people eat a festive meal which includes Israeli food as well as sing Israeli songs. All mourning practices associated with the Omer period are suspended, as weddings and other public celebrations are permitted.

In synagogues special Psalms are recited, in addition to Al HaNisim, on the miracles. Many use a special Torah reading, Deuteronomy 7:12-8:18, which includes:

You shall faithfully observe all the Instruction that I enjoin upon you today, that you may thrive and increase and be able to possess the land that the LORD promised on oath to your fathers. (8:1)

The service can also include a special Haftarah from Isaiah (10:32-12:6) in addition to the Prayer for the State of Israel.

These two days, Yom HaZikaron and Yom Ha Atzma'ut, show the State of Israel at its lowest and highest points. There is real mourning and commemoration of all of the fallen soldiers, for the Israelis to remember those who fought so hard for the independence. But then as a new day starts, the people celebrate that hard-fought independence.

The spirit and hope for Israel is embodied in the national anthem, HaTikvah. One translation of its lyrics follows:

**As long as the Jewish spirit is yearning  
deep in the heart,  
With eyes turned toward the East,  
looking toward Zion,  
Then our hope - the two-thousand-year-old  
hope - will not be lost:  
To be a free people in our land,  
The land of Zion and Jerusalem.**
