RABBI'S MESSAGE



As I write this, we are in the beginning of the month of *Elul*. *Elul* is the last month of the Jewish year [think December on the Gregorian calendar] and is the time to prepare for the month of *Tishrei*, which is home to *Rosh HaShana*, *Yom Kippur*, *Sukkot* and *Simchat Torah*.

Elul is the time to prepare for a new beginning, the coming of the New Year. As one who can very easily procrastinate, I find it exceedingly helpful to have reminders to prepare. Preparation enables me to move thoughtfully in a direction of my choosing, rather than tumbling at warp speed and crash landing at an unintended destination.

Here are some thoughts about preparing for the New Year:

The word *Elul* is spelled with the Hebrew letters *aleph, lamed, vav, lamed.*

An acronym is made out of the letters of the word *Elul*, as a way to frame the preparation one can do during this month.

Aleph = ani Lamed = l'dodi Vav = v'dodi Lamed = li

This translates to mean: I am To my beloved And my beloved Is to me

If you don't connect with that translation, try this way of understanding these ideas:

I give love
And this act of love
Generates more love
Either directly back to me
Or out into the world more generally

I invite you to think about three categories of love, three categories of beloved relationships that are described below. Make the time to really check in with yourself and see if there are ways in which you want to grow or change in these three different facets of relationship. In addition to delineating these categories of love and beloved relationship, I've included wisdom from the Torah that speaks to the growth that's possible in each of these relationships.

1/ How do I show up in **relationship with G-d** and/or that which is beyond me? In Hebrew, this relationship is called *ben adam l'Makom*, which translates to mean that which is between a person and G-d.

To show up for my relationship with G-d and/or that which is beyond me, I am asked to express gratitude. In Deuteronomy chapter 8, verse 10 we read, "when you have eaten your fill, give thanks to the LORD your G-d for the good land which G-d has given you."

In other words, there are countless opportunities for gratitude. Even in the simplest moments, I can make the space to express gratitude for all that I've been given, for all that is beyond me.

2/ How do I show up in **relationship with myself**? In Hebrew, this relationship is called *ben adam l'atzmo*, which translates to mean that which is between a person and oneself.

To show up for my relationship with myself, I must open my heart to that which is hardened or blocked. In Deuteronomy Chapter 10, verse 16, we read, "cut away the thickening of your hearts and stiffen your necks no more."

In other words:

Don't be so stubborn. Clear out the hardened bits that are getting in the way; make room for love.

3/ How do I show up for my **relationship with another**? In Hebrew, this relationship is called *ben adam l'chaver*, which translates to mean between a person and another.

To show up for my relationship with others, I am asked to give, to share. In Deuteronomy Chapter 10, verse 18, we read, "uphold the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and befriends the stranger, providing the stranger with food and clothing."

In other words:

There are people in the world who need me. Reach out. Take care of others. Give and share what I have with those around me.

Elul is here. The time to prepare for the New Year is now. I don't have to tumble at warp speed, crash landing at an unintended destination. I can decide how I want to show up in the world, how I want to give love, how I want to act lovingly in the world. I can think about how I want to do this in my relationship with G-d and/or that which is beyond me, in my relationship with myself and in my relationship with others.

May each of us have the strength to think about all of this in the coming weeks, intentionally and thoughtfully charting a course for a new year where we each get to be who we want to be in the world by giving love in ways that generates more love in the world.

Wishing everyone a *shanah tovah u'metuka* - a good and sweet new year that is full of love!

TASHLICH AT CRANDALL PARK 1st Day Rosh Hashanah Monday, September 30, 2019 At 4:30 PM

What is the purpose of Tashlich?

This custom, which means "to cast off," is generally performed on the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah unless it falls on a Saturday. Jews go to a stream, river, ocean or lake (it should be a living body of water) and throw bread crumbs into the water as a way of symbolically casting away sins. The tradition is based on a verse from the Book of Micah: "God will take us back in love; God will vanquish our iniquities and cast our sins into the depths of the sea." The Tashlich prayer recited contains these verses and selected chapters from Psalms.

For many Jews, Rosh Hashanah is a time for reciting many words. Through Tashlich, we use our bodies and actions to do the work of return. Although the rabbinic authorities originally objected to this ritual, Jews stubbornly performed it until it became a "traditional" part of the holiday.

We have lost many long-time members. Many have passed away and others have moved out of the area. Our membership is now less than 50% of what it was when we embarked on our building renovations in 1992. Our dues have not gone up. We depend on dues, fundraising and donations to provide you with the services you have come to expect. We discontinued Bingo due to lack of volunteers. It was our biggest fund raiser. We are looking into the possibility of renting out space in our lower level next year as a

means of additional income but this is not definite yet.

Dues currently make up one quarter of our financial requirements. We have been fortunate to have had very successful Yom Kippur Appeals each and every year. DANCING WITH THE TORAH

Join us to celebrate Simchat Torah with prayer and dancing!

Monday and Tuesday, October 21-22, 2019.



Simchat Torah is the day on which we read the last part of the Torah and roll it right back to the beginning to read the first part. Like Sukkot, Simchat Torah is a happy time. On Sukkot we're

thankful for the harvest which gives us food for our bodies. On Simchat Torah we're thankful for the Torah which gives us food for thought.

The Torah is probably the most important Jewish object there is. We show it much honor. We stand when it is taken out or put away. We stand whenever it is held up. We give it the same honor that people would show a king.

On Simchat Torah the congregation dances with the Torah scrolls. All the Torah scrolls are removed from the Aron Kodesh (Holy Ark) and distributed to members of the congregation. One member leads the other Torah-bearing members in a circuit around the Synagogue. The leader leads the congregation in reciting special prayers. When the circuit is completed, the congregation sings and dances until it is time to start the next hakafa (circuit). This is done seven times.
