RABBI'S REPORT

Hello Congregation Shaaray Tefila!

At the synagogue over *Yom Kippur*, I shared some words of Torah that offered a frame for thinking about Jewish time as a circle, a cycle.

On Simchat Torah we completed the circle, the cycle, of the Torah by reading the last Torah portion, Zot HaBracha, in the book of Deuteronomy. At shul, I invited everyone to come look at the end of the Torah, in part to take the opportunity to see what the end of the Torah looks like, but also to pay special attention to the very last letter of the Torah.

Judaism constantly calls us to notice and balance that which is opposite - light and dark, the holy and the common place, shabbat and the rest of the week. By connecting that which is in opposition to each other, we engage in the holy work of creating wholeness.

After reading the final words of the Torah we followed the tradition of Simchat Torah, immediately reading the very beginning of the Torah, the first verses in the book of Genesis. Here, too, I invited everyone at shul to come look at the beginning of the Torah, to witness first hand where the Torah begins and to take special notice of the very first letter of the Torah.

The last letter of the Torah is a *lammed* [d] and the first letter of the Torah is *bet* [d]. When we take the last letter of the Torah and add the first letter of the Torah we get the word d, which means heart.



The Torah in its completeness is the heart of the Jewish people. The holy circle, the cycle of reading Torah, is meant to create connections between the holy text of our people and the hearts of each individual.

The process of moving from an ending to a beginning, connecting two opposite poles, is a process of creating wholeness. May the circle, the cycle of this new year bring each of us abundant opportunities to find and feel the strings that connect our hearts to the Torah. May we be blessed to engage with Torah and Judaism with our whole heart, bring wholeness into our lives, into the lives of our community and into the whole world!

MEMBER ARTICLE Love from Sunny Buchman !

Dearest Family and Friends,

Shabbat Shalom! & Chag Sameach!

Here at Lantern Hill I belong to a writer's group. Each month we write a piece to share with the others in the group. Below is the piece I wrote for our October meeting:

From Darkness to Light

For the past two years after moving to New Providence, NJ, I returned to Glens Falls, NY, my hometown, to attend services at Congregation Shaaray Tefila for the two days of Rosh Hashanah, the start of the Jewish New Year. Congregation Shaaray Tefila is my lifetime synagogue and the synagogue of my family for five generations. This year, however, since my son-in-law passed away in March, I felt it important to be with my daughter and grandchildren at their synagogue in Scotch Plains. In the meantime, since living in New Providence, I have, in addition to my membership at Congregation Shaaray Tefila in Glens Falls, joined Congregation Ohr Shalom in Summit where, thanks to the Lantern Hill shuttle, I am able to go to worship every Saturday morning. All three synagogues are conservative and traditional and use the same prayers and melodies with only minor differences in ritual, and while I feel at home in all three Temples it meant a lot to me to be worshipping together with my family.

During the Rosh Hashanah service, the Shofar, a ram's horn, is blown multiple times in a proscribed manner. It represents a wake-up call to the Israelites. This year, at my daughter's Temple, I was literally blown away by the blowing of the Shofar. I am always especially moved by this part of the service, but this time I had an out of body experience. I felt I was actually standing at Sinai with my ancestors, the Israelites, as they heard the Shofar blowing and pledged themselves to God. Every part of my body was reacting to the call of the Shofar. It is very difficult to blow the Shofar. It takes tremendous technique and breath support, and the young man nailed the rhythms and tone to perfection. My body reacted viscerally. I became awake to the strident call to not only want to strive to be a better person, but to do my share in Tikkun Olam which means to be God's partner in helping repair the world.

I awoke this morning, two days after Rosh Hashanah, very early. It was still pitch black outside. I sat quietly in a chair in my living room looking out the window mesmerized as I watched the blackness turn to light. Slowly the trees and mountains in the distance became visible. Later the light turned to sunlight playing on the Bell Pavilion building that faces the window in the dining room section of my large room. The hours have passed since I first awoke, and the sunlight is now playing on the top of the trees just beyond the last apartment at Bell. The sky is a beautiful light blue with not a cloud in sight.

Of late I have become so discouraged by the mess we humans have made in the world, of our disregard of taking care of each other as well as our responsibilities to take care of our planet, to care for the sick, the poor and the stranger in need.

But hearing the clear and powerful call of the Shofar, I became aroused to be alive to do my part, small as it may be, to once again feel optimistic, to feel that goodness and love can and will prevail. And watching the miracle of the blackness of the night be transformed into the light of day until sunlight brought warmth and the promise of a beautiful day, my spirits soared and I thanked God with gratitude for renewing me as we celebrate the start of a new year.
