Shalom everyone and Happy August / Elul.

As I write this update, I have just finished honoring the saddest day in the Jewish calendar, Tisha B'Av, from the Old City in Jerusalem. While the month of Av brings us sorrow and anguish, the month of Elul is filled with a more hopeful spirit, as we slowly prepare ourselves for the Yamim Noraim-Days of Awe.

During the Shabbatot of August 6-7 (Parsha Re'eh) and August 27-28 (Parsha Ki Tavo), I will be leading services in person. As we push forward in both the desert and in the Book of Deuteronomy, we being to feel an increased sense of exciting energy. Moses's time is short in this world, and the Jews, no longer an unorganized group of godless, lawless Israelites, are posted to enter into the Promised Land. All we await is one last re-telling of our desert experience.

The month of Elul is one long, hurry-up and wait moment on the Jewish calendar. Elul is about making commitments, and Tishrei is about being held accountable to those commitments. Let us use these

months to reestablish what matters and who matters the most in our lives, let them know it, and then make the time to show it.
