Shalom Aleichem!

I am wishing you all peace and well-being as we begin two new months in the coming week. This year we begin the month of Av in the Hebrew Calendar just three days before we welcome the month of August in the Gregorian Calendar. Over these coming weeks, I am eager to meet many of you, precious members of the Shaaray Tefilah community, and to begin to get to know each other!



This is a season of long, late-Summer days when we can feel the cumulative heat of the Summer so far and simultaneously begin to notice the waning of this Summer season. As it is written in *Kohelet - Ecclesiastes 3:1*, the special sacred text to which we will return when the summer has fully passed and we welcome Fall with *Sukkos*:

“For everything, there is a season, a time for every longing under the skies.”

לכל זמן ועת לכל-הפך תחת השמים

In many ways, this is a season of transition - for me and for all of us collectively. I am preparing to conclude a summer of training in pastoral care and chaplaincy at a community hospital in Beverly, MA while I am also preparing to begin a year of service to your community with my first Zoom offering over Tisha B'Av and my first weekend visit in the middle of August. Collectively, we are preparing to finish the book of BaMidbar, *Numbers*, the accounting of our ancestors treacherous years of wandering in the wilderness, while we are also preparing to begin the book of Devarim, *Deuteronomy*, the retelling of our people's story through the final words of Moshe, our greatest teacher and leader.

As we look towards Tisha B'Av, the day upon which we commemorate many tragedies which have befallen us as a people, we soften the celebratory mood which often colors our Summer days, especially in places like Glens Falls, which I hear is beautiful in the summer. Traditionally, in these

three weeks leading up to Tisha B'Av, we refrain from holding weddings and we begin to look ahead to the season of teshuva, our High Holidays and the larger season of repentance. We allow awareness to arise within us of our souls' desire to learn and grow as we look towards the year ahead.

So, I look forward with excitement and anticipation to sharing time and space together over the coming weeks and months! For now, I leave you with a few of the words of Moshe to the people of Israel as they stood together on the edge of the land of Israel in Devarim 2:7,

כִּי יְהוָה אֱלֹהֶיךָ בֵּרַכְךָ בְּכָל מַעֲשֵׂה יָדָךְ

“Surely, the Ever-Present Your G-d has blessed you, through all with which you are involved.”

In this season, may you feel and be blessed in all that you do!

Kirtan (also known as Bhajan) is a form of chant developed in India to heighten participation, communal feeling and ecstatic communion with the divine. Its usual, distinguishing feature is a formula of singing based on call-and-response. The chant facilitator offers something and then the participants return the favor.

Kirtan is fully participatory. It breaks down the barrier between "leader" and "listener." Its improvisational and experimental nature, make it a fun, yet strangely deep game to play – for both adults and children.



Rabbi Andrew Hahn (Reb Drew) holds a Ph.D. in Jewish Thought from the Jewish Theological Seminary (Conservative) and received rabbinic ordination from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (Reform). He has also studied at the feet of Rabbi Zalman

Schachter-Shalomi, founder of the Jewish Renewal Movement. Dubbed "a Shlomo Carlebach for the twenty-first century," he weaves traditional Jewish liturgy and musical modes into the increasingly popular call-and-response chant technology from India, known as Kirtan.

SALOMON CHARHON

In the February, 2022 bulletin, Katie began a new project to feature one member (hopefully!) each month. This month we are featuring Salomon Charhon. Here is his story as told to Katie:



I was born on June 2, 1949 to Regina and Albert Charhon in Elisabethville in the Belgian Congo, now known as Lubumbashi, Democratic Republic of the Congo. Both of my parents originated from the Island of Rhodes (or Rodos in Italy) and did not know each other at the time. The island became part of Greece after WWII. Dad moved to the Congo in the thirties and Mom was moving with family to the United States. They were Jews trying to escape before the war but there were issues with the families moving to the United States so they sent my mom to stay with a brother who had already moved to the Congo. She met my dad and got married. The rest of her family eventually ended up moving to the U.S.

I was the youngest child of Regina and Alberto. I have an older brother, David and a sister Sol who

was a year younger than David. Sadly, she passed away in 2010. I was born five years after my sister. My father sent David to boarding school in Brussels with the idea of a better education so he could come back and take over the family business. He then sent my sister to boarding school in Cape Town, South Africa because of the civil war in the Congo. Since it was getting so dangerous in the Congo, the plan was for the family to immigrate to America. My brother moved to America from Belgium. My parents and I moved to South Africa. Soon after, my sister moved to America from South Africa. Unfortunately, it took us almost six years to get a green card. We were not together as a family for eight years.

I knew no more than a few words of English so the school in Sea Point set me back one year. At the end of my first year, I jumped ahead two years so I was back where I was supposed to be. I finished high school on December 2, 1966 and left for America on December 4, 1966. We stopped in Israel and arrived in America on December 17, 1966.

My father and mother were very religious. My father went to synagogue every Friday evening and Saturday morning. I joined him. We lived a stone's throw from the synagogue. He was very generous to them and also very giving to Israel.

I had a job within two weeks of graduating high school rebuilding small valves, some welding and light mechanical work. I only worked there for six months before I went to work for a Jewish owned company, wholesale clothing, order picking, stocking, shipping. About five men who worked there had been in concentration camps. Elaine's dad worked there and pushed me to ask Elaine out. I guess he knew more than me.

Elaine Israel was born in Seattle, WA on September 18, 1949 to Rebecca & Isaac Israel. She is the middle child with an older brother Gerald Israel who passed away in 2008. She is close to her younger brother David who lives in Palm Desert, CA with his wife Lois.

Elaine and I got married on October 25, 1970.

I worked with Elaine's dad for thirteen years before going to work for a small wholesale specialty food warehouse where I soon became the Assistant Warehouse Manager and then Manager. Unfortunately, the company was in financial trouble and we all lost our jobs. For the next twelve months, I took on part time jobs until I found a good job. I spent the next thirteen years at a boating supply company where I became Shipping Manager.

Our son Albert was born on October 30, 1972. He was named after his two grandfathers: Albert, my dad who also went by Alberto (Italian) and Elaine's dad Issac. In my family, none of us have middle names. Elaine does not have one either.

On January 4, 2000, I suffered a back injury on the job. The manager turned against me and tried illegally to get rid of me and broke the rules when it came to dealing with an injured worker. He forced me to not follow the light duty rules and made sure I was forced to do very heavy work which made my injury much worse. Finally, I stopped working on June 30, 2000 and have been paying the price with pain everyday since; going on 23 years now.

In 2001, I started volunteering at Seattle's Children's Hospital, mostly in the Hematology / Oncology Ward. I also worked on a lot of fundraisers.

We moved to New York in 2006 to be closer to our son Albert (and Rebecca) who moved to NY in 1999. We have gone back to Seattle a few times to see family. I lost my mother on May 9, 2009 and my sister on May 10, 2010. I now do volunteer work (which I absolutely love!) at Albany Children's Hospital and the radiation center at Saratoga Hospital. I am so fortunate to be among amazing children, their families and the hospital staff. I often see synagogue members Dr. Alex Frank, who is in charge of the radiation center, and Dr. Mark Hoffman, who works with cancer patients. We are so fortunate that our congregation has two amazing doctors who have one of the toughest jobs there is. They are both very simple, down-to-Earth human beings and I consider it an honor to be around them.

Shaaray Tefila feels like home to me. People are kind. They help each other, and appreciate each other. Everyone was so friendly and welcoming when we started attending services. People only said nice things about each other and everyone got along well. Sermons aren't about politics. When someone is sick, people care and call to see how you are doing. Everyone helps out before, during and after an oneg and kiddush.

Temple Beth El and Shaaray Tefila are so fortunate to have Katie Weaver run our offices. And it's amazing how much Mark Hoffman and Larry Greenberg do for our congregation. We would be lost without them.
