L'Shanah Tovah! To a Good year! As we wrap up the month of September, we welcome in a new year on our Jewish calendar. Spending Rosh Hashanah in Glens



Falls was a wonderful experience for me! I enjoyed getting to share with you in prayer, to get to know many more members of the community and to share my reflections on the themes of this time of year. Now, as we welcome October and look ahead to Yom Kippur, we are in a period of ongoing reflection, introspection and repentance.

We repeated these words together from a classic heart-wrenching section of our high holiday liturgy. Jewish tradition teaches us that in this season each of our actions carry extra weight. Even more so than other times of year, each of our choices will send waves out into the world which will impact others. We hope that we will all be sealed in the book of life for the year to come and we are offered a week to begin to behave in better and more compassionate ways.

In uncertain anticipation of what the year ahead will hold for us, we are encouraged by our tradition to make the most of these fall days. We put in effort to rectify conflicts in our relationships and come to mutual understanding and reconciliation. This is the perfect time to reach out to a friend or relative with whom you have previously had conflict or simply fallen out of touch. Tell them what they mean to you and try to return warmth and tenderness into your relationship. As the leaves start to change color and even fall from the trees, we are reminded of the preciousness of our lives and the lives of our loved ones. This season provides us with a chance to tell others what they mean to us and to affirm our care and support for one another.

Though I write to you now from the days in between our New Year and Day of Atonement, these holy days will pass us by early in the month of October. After Yom Kippur, there will still be Sukkot and Simchat Torah. Our holiday season

extends through most of October. Though the mood becomes progressively more joyous as we march ahead towards Simchat Torah, we remain called to the difficult interpersonal work of teshuva, of repentance and reconciliation. Even though Yom Kippur will soon be in our rearview mirror, let us not lose sight of the constant need for compassionate and considerate ways of relating to each other. Even as we move past the high holiday season, we will still have the responsibility and the opportunity to choose how we want to be in this year to come. I pray this year will bring connection, community, good health and ongoing spiritual growth for each and every member of our community!
