

STUDENT RABBI MICAH FRIEDMAN

Hodesh Tov! A good month! This is one of our traditional Jewish greetings for a new month. Again, as we approach the month of September, we also approach a new Jewish month: Elul. אלול

In August, I made my first visit to Glens Falls and had the chance to meet a number of you at services and the community picnic. I loved the chance to start to get to know the community and look forward to further connections.

Elul, the month which precedes Rosh HaShanah, invites us into a mindset of reflection. While on Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur we appeal to G-d to treat us with more mercy than judgement so that we may be healthy and happy in the coming year, during the month of Elul, we have the opportunity to prepare ourselves for the year ahead by reflecting on our lives in this current year that we are readying to conclude. This process is called Heshbon Nefesh - accounting of the soul. Like any accounting, it's an opportunity to pay careful attention and to add up the costs of our choices. Like calculating a budget, this spiritual work challenges us to consider where we might need to make changes in the future in order to maximize our goals.

According to tradition, the name of the month Elul is actually an acronym for:

אני לדודי ודודי לי

I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine

Song of Songs 6:3. This month of Elul in which we reflect on our lives through an evaluative lens is also a time of passionate love, a month when we're taught that G-d's abundant and abiding love for us is more apparent and accessible than throughout the year.

Somehow, this time of accounting is also a season of love. How can these two moods coincide?

I would like to suggest that without love, there can be no reckoning. When we know that someone loves us and will continue to do so even though we make mistakes, that love offers us the safety to admit to ourselves that we have actually made mistakes for which we need to apologize and from which we need to learn. So too, in our relationship with the Source of Life. In Elul, as the Summer starts to cool, we are reminded of the infinite love God has for each of us despite our missteps life. This love enables and empowers us to take an

honest accounting of how we would like to grow in the year ahead.

On Shabbat, looking ahead to the month of Elul, we offered the blessing of the month. I will reiterate a few words of the ceremony as a prayer for all of us that this coming month can bring us lives filled with goodness and blessing, safety and prosperity, lives without shame or embarrassment and instead filled with love and awe.

Kirtan (also known as Bhajan) is a form of chant developed in India to heighten participation, communal feeling and ecstatic communion with the divine. Its usual, distinguishing feature is a formula of singing based on call-and-response. The chant facilitator offers something and then the participants return the favor.

Kirtan is fully participatory. It breaks down the barrier between "leader" and "listener." Its improvisational and experimental nature, make it a fun, yet strangely deep game to play – for both adults and children.



Rabbi Andrew Hahn (Reb Drew) holds a Ph.D. in Jewish Thought from the Jewish Theological Seminary (Conservative) and received rabbinic ordination from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (Reform). He has also studied at the feet of Rabbi Zalman Schachter-Shalomi, founder of the Jewish Renewal Movement. Dubbed "a

Shlomo Carlebach for the twenty-first century," he weaves traditional Jewish liturgy and musical modes into the increasingly popular call-and-response chant technology from India, known as Kirtan.

HILDA SCHWARTZ

In the February, 2022 bulletin, Katie began a new project to feature one member (hopefully!) each month. This month we are featuring Hilda Schwartz. Here is her story:

Hilda (Aronson) Schwartz will be 94 years old on November 6. She was born in Glens Falls Hospital.

Her parents were Gusta & Barney Aronson. Barney was a Pharmacist and owned Aronson's Pharmacy on Broad Street in Glens Falls, NY. Barney & Gusta, his store helpmate, were kind, caring and generous people. Sick people telephoned their home at odd hours when Barney was sleeping. He would awake and go downstairs from his home to his store to fill prescriptions. If his customers were too poor to pay, he would give them the medication telling them not to worry. He told them they could pay when they were able. Many were never able to pay him back. On holidays, he and his wife would leave food on poor neighbors' doorways so they would have something special to eat. This was the example that was set for Hilda.

Hilda was the oldest of three daughters, followed by Shirley Kanofsky (Sid) who are both deceased. The youngest sister is Betty (Paula) Segal (Harvey, deceased).

Hilda married Moe (Morris) Schwartz who served in the Navy in WWII as an electrician. They met at Mt. McGregor at a dance held for returning military men invited for a free weekend to relax after the war ended. Neither had wanted to attend yet their friends had convinced them to go.

A group of Glens Falls High School girls came on a bus to dance with the men. As Hilda left the bus, she broke her high heel shoe. Moe noticed Hilda limping along while holding her shoe. He volunteered unsuccessfully to fix her shoe. They spent the rest of the night talking and dancing. That began their whirlwind romance that led to 70 years of marriage. They married on November 9, 1946 in Albany, NY because it was closer for New York relatives to attend the wedding.

Before Hilda had met Moe, Hilda's Aunt Al Gersten encouraged her to enroll in college. Aunt Al always set a high value on family and education. She was very close to Hilda. In those days, women usually did not have careers. Although Hilda attended classes for several weeks, she withdrew after her marriage. Hilda never regretted her choice.

Moe started Hill Electric Supply Company (named after Hilda) two years after they were married. He took his Navy pay and borrowed money from his sister Laura because no bank would loan him money.

Moe was a lifelong Jewish War Veteran. He and Hilda traveled yearly to attend many of Moe's ship reunions throughout their marriage. He was also a Mason and a Shriner and he held the highest position, Potentate. At Shaaray Tefila, Moe served on the Chevra Kadisha Committee, helping to prepare fellow Jewish men's bodies for burial.

Hilda and Moe have four children: Roz Winston (Mike-deceased), Diane Gellman (David), Jeff Schwartz (Patti) and Scott Schwartz (Michele). They have five grandchildren: Rachel Winston Long (Jon Paul), Vanessa & Steven Schwartz, David & Daniel Schwartz. They have three great grandchildren: Lily, Sophie and Ian Long.

What makes Hilda special? Hilda grew up in Glens Falls surrounded by a loving family and a small Jewish community. She loved her family, friends and the Synagogue.

She was an old-fashioned housewife who cooked and cleaned, shopped for food bargains, and drove her children to Hebrew and Sunday School. She visited the sick, went to all funerals and took care of her parents in their old age with her sisters Shirley and Betty.

During the Jewish Holidays, Hilda made delicious meals for 20 guests. She invited family, friends, Jewish students and anyone who had no place to eat. One student from Iran became a weekly guest for Shabbat and holidays his entire stay in Glens Falls. The friendship continued for many years after he moved away.

On Passover, Hilda always cooked 20-30 sponge cakes delivering them to family, friends and Jewish prisoners at Comstock Prison. She visited lonely people and sometimes brought them chicken soup and homemade applesauce.

Hilda had great respect for her parents and her in-laws, Chanja and Pinchas, who she called Ma & Pa. Both sets of parents were originally Orthodox and Kosher. Hilda kept kosher to honor her parents and in-laws so that they would be able to eat at her home.

A few weeks before every Rosh Hashanah, Hilda's mother-in-law, Chanja, would visit and they would cook non-stop from 6am to 12am. They made honey cake, European apple pie, Kreplach, strudel, kugel, challahs and cookies. Hilda would then freeze and date these goodies which would last until the next year when they would have another cooking marathon.

Hilda was greatly influenced by her grandparents Samuel and Anna Aronson, whom she called Bubbie & Zaydie. Her parents and grandparents shaped her

Jewish identity and values. She grew up visiting them and all of her aunts, uncles and cousins because everyone lived a few blocks away.

Jewish travelers were always invited to eat at her grandparent's home. Hilda loved visiting her grandparents because there were always interesting conversations, news about families living in other communities and Torah discussions. Men came daily to their home to daven because most religious Jewish men lived in the neighborhood near Montcalm Street. It was expensive to heat up the Synagogue on Bay Street and the family owned a Torah so that the Torah could be read on Mondays and Thursdays there.

Every Friday before Shabbat, Bubbie Aronson would cook a complete Shabbos meal and send this to each of her children and their families.

On Passover, the entire family would attend a large Seder at her grandparent's home which included grandchildren and eventually great-grandchildren.

The Aronsons own the first row upstairs in the Synagogue on the left side facing the Bimah. All of the family sat there and continue to sit there when in Glens Falls.

Year ago, an Aronson family member, who we believe was Ben Yomen, Hilda's great-grandfather, brought a Torah from Russia by way of New York City to Glens Falls. The Jewish community celebrated this event by forming a parade and dancing in the streets. After praying stopped at the Montcalm St. home, Bill Aronson donated the Torah to a FL synagogue. Years later when Judy Aronson moved to FL, she discovered that the Torah in her Shul was the same previously owned Aronson Torah. The Synagogue has promised to return the Torah to Judy or her son Mark Aronson if the congregation ever disbands. Because of this contract, the beloved Aronson Torah still remains protected and in stewardship by our Aronson family today.

Previously, Hilda's parents & grandparents had instilled positive Jewish attitudes, rituals and involvement in the Jewish Community. Hilda continued passing on this legacy to her children. She always lit Shabbat candles, cooked a delicious meal and then frequently the family attended Friday night services in which her children participated.

Hilda was a two-term Past President of Shaaray Tefila Sisterhood. Later she became Co-President with her cousin Harrie Bobbin. Then she became involved with Sisterhood Membership. She often invited new and potential members to welcome them into her caring home to enjoy refreshments and conversation. Hilda is also a life member of Hadassah.

Hilda, her sister Shirley and cousin Harrie Bobbin took on the responsibility for the Saturday Kiddish

grandchildren also attended either Sunday School and/or Hebrew School there. Sons Jeff, Scott and grandchildren Vanessa, Steven and David all had their Bar and Bat Mitzvahs at the Synagogue.

Roz, Diane and Jeff were members of USY (United Synagogue Youth). Scott was a member of BBYO (B'Nai Brith Youth Organization). Roz created the USY Bulletin and Diane was Program VP. Years later they continued to be actively involved in their communities and eventually both daughters became honored as Woman of the Year. Roz was President for two years in B'Nai Brith Women and Diane was Program and Membership VP for many years in Hadassah.

Jeff and Scott became Sunday School Teachers and both worked on Bingo to raise money for the Synagogue. Jeff was the Sunday School Treasurer and Scott created many innovative programs including lunches honoring our Jewish Members at the Synagogue and Temple.

Hilda and Moe, all of their children and grandchildren have traveled to Israel. In 1965, Roz received the second Israel Scholarship sponsored jointly by the Synagogue, Temple and ZOA (Zionists of America).

Hilda is famous for her newsy handwritten letters and heartfelt cards to family and friends. Everyone treasures her correspondence and keeps letters and cards for years. Her communication, visits and telephone conversations keep her connected and close to family and friends throughout her life. Even now, she still enjoys her nieces, nephews, cousins, children, grandchildren, great grandchildren and friends like Bonnie Yanklowitz, Dolly Morrissey and Claire Kantrowitz phoning or visiting. It's one of her greatest pleasures to be remembered with cards for the New Year or on her birthday.

Hilda thoroughly enjoys the Synagogue Bulletin which is mailed to her and she reads it from cover to cover to stay informed and connected to the Glens Falls Jewish Community.

Hilda also loved to write poetry and vignettes. She joined a poetry writing group that self-published an anthology of the class's finished poetry works. Years later, she attended a poetry reading group with daughter Diane and son-in-law David. Hilda loved to stand up and read her poetry at the microphone. She was always praised for her exceptional poems.

As a child, Hilda dreamed about traveling to exotic places. Before meeting her husband, she had only vacationed once in Florida with her dad and sister Shirley. She got her wish. She and Moe traveled extensively throughout Europe, Asia, Israel, the




USA and Canada. They visited most, if not all, of our National Parks.

Hilda and Moe were Snowbirds for many years until they sold their Glens Falls home. Then they returned yearly to visit family and friends while still maintaining their membership at the Synagogue. Moe died in 2016 and is buried at the Shaaray Tefila Synagogue Cemetery. Hilda currently resides in West Palm Beach, Florida at her home and still continues to be a member of the Synagogue and Sisterhood.

While Hilda was President of Sisterhood, she wrote the following to the tune of "When You're Smiling." It was sung by the ladies during a program at the Synagogue.

Because you're doing good.
Won't you join us
We'll bring out your best
There's lots of ladies here
With friends you'll be blessed
So won't you line up
