SHEVAT-ADAR 5783

STUDENT RABBI MICAH FRIEDMAN



Hodesh Tov! Here's to a good new month to you and yours and all of us! In January, I had the precious opportunity to make two visits to Glen Falls. We gathered for spirited Shabbat services, delicious kiddush

lunches, and sweet schmoozing. In February, I will be returning for another Shabbat in the middle of the month and I look forward to seeing and spending time with all of you at the shul! May this new month provide us all with new opportunities to learn, grow, and deepen in our relationships with each other, our cherished Jewish tradition, and with our Blessed Creator!

As we enter February, we also welcome the Jewish month of Shevat. In Shevat, we celebrate the new year of trees, often called Tu BiShevat, and the story of this celebration is a story of renewal and revival across the many generations of our people. Even though the earliest layer of rabbinic tradition recorded the holiday of Tu BiShevat, this day was largely uncelebrated for many generations. In Ancient Israel this New Year of Trees was used to determine the age of fruits. You might wonder: why does it matter how old a fruit is? There is a mitzvah (commandment) in the Torah to allow newly planted trees to grow for three years before harvesting their fruit (Leviticus 19:23). Since it would be burdensome to record and remember when exactly each fruit tree was planted, Tu BiShevat became a standard "date of birth." After a tree had stood for 3 Tu BiShevat's, then we were able to eat freely of its fruits and to share the fruits with our hungry brothers and sisters.

This layer of the holiday's history may seem quite technical. In fact, it is. It was likely for this reason that in the many generations when very few Jews lived in the Land of Israel that this holiday was largely unacknowledged. However, in the century following the expulsion of Jews from Spain, many Jews from Catholic-ruled countries resettled in the land of Israel. In these generations, there was a mystical, spiritual revival often associated with Rabbi Isaac Luria of Safed, may his memory be a

blessing. The Kabballah (a term for mystical elements within Jewish tradition) encouraged Jews to open ourselves up to greater spiritual awareness, to connect with sparks of Divine light within our bodies and within the natural world around us. In this era, Tu BiShevat took on new layers of meaning and significance. This festival of trees began to symbolize the possibilities of deep connection with the plant life which sustains human life.

Again, when the Zionist movement led many Jews to return to the land of Israel, Tu BiShevat grew in prominence. The Jewish National Fund and other organizations seized upon this holiday as an opportunity to promote the planting of trees in Israel. Surely, many of us are familiar with the practice of paying to have a tree planted in the Land of Israel as a way of honoring a loved one, perhaps for a bar mitzvah or a wedding. This era of Jewish history promoted reconnecting with the land of Israel in particular as an ethical responsibility that could offer Jews new possibilities for a prosperous life and a culturally rich community.

In the recent decades, Tu BiShevat has again been reclaimed and renewed. This time, many Jewish environmentalists have attached themselves to Tu BiShevat as a kind of inherently Jewish "arbor day." This day, and in fact the entire month of Shevat, has become a reminder of the importance of taking responsibility for the stewardship of the Earth in all of the many locales and lands in which we find ourselves. In the spirit of the ancient day which reflected the Torah's simultaneous commitment to care for trees and to care for vulnerable people, Tu BiShevat now invites us to recommit ourselves to work for the healing of the planet. In this spirit, I pray that we can all find our own ways during the cold month ahead, to deepen our connection with the plant life that surrounds us and upon which we depend for our sustenance. Let us open our hearts to appreciate our interconnectedness with these other forms of life and find opportunities to act as guardians of G-d's creation.




