Happy Spring! Though we have now officially entered the astronomical season of Spring, we still look forward to our Spring festival of Passover which is right around the corner! In the middle of the month of

Nisan, like Jews all around the world, we will gather for a celebratory and ceremonial feast. We will recount the perilous journeys of our ancestors and draw from the spiritual resources which nourished them to also provide nourishment for our souls. We will ask questions, sing songs, and see ourselves as if we were freed from bondage. I am looking forward to celebrating with you over Passover as we gather for a community seder and for yontif tefillah together!

Yet, now, we find ourselves in the time of preparation for Pesach. It is an ancient custom to spend weeks preparing for Pesach. Of course, we clean our homes of *hametz* to avoid encountering the forbidden leavened products. Many of us kasher our kitchens, or remove special dishes dedicated for the holiday season. But, all this work of preparation can feel laborious. It can weigh heavily upon us. If you would like to ask questions or get support with the practical aspects of preparing for Pesach, please feel free to reach out. Yet, what is this preparation work really about anyways?

Our ancient rabbis, of blessed memory, taught that *hametz* represents the human inclination to wickedness. Like bread, this inclination is a central part of human experience. Each and every one of us has appetites that we pursue and, to some degree, we need to pursue these appetites. Yet, it is important that we become aware and self-reflective about our inclinations. In the weeks leading up to Pesach, it is incumbent upon each and every one of us to go through a process of self-reflection, to honestly appraise our motivations, and to try to clean out the contaminants we encounter. In some ways, this is a process that perfectly parallels our introspection before the Fall high holydays.

So, as we look forward with excitement and anticipation to the joyous occasion of celebrating

Passover together, we are also invited to reflect on our lives since the last Passover. Do a little Spring cleaning of the soul, with hope that this can enable us to experience new growth and liberation in the season ahead.

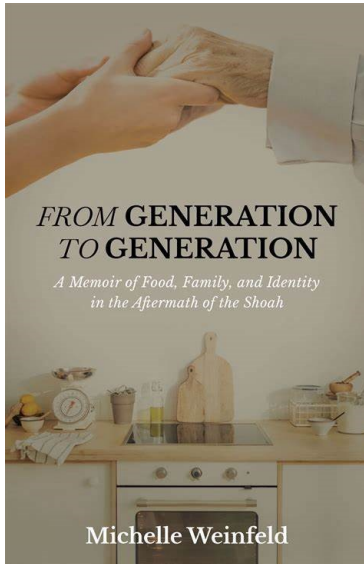

TEMPLE-SYNAGOGUE RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

As I write this, we are coming to the end of March and we find ourselves in the midst of another Jewish holiday season. I am so excited to reflect on the accomplishments of our school. We celebrated Tu B'Shvat by planting our own seeds that will become herbs and flowers and then Purim by dressing up in costume and making Hamantaschen. These activities would not have happened without our staff and wonderful volunteers. Our nature activity with planting evolved from decorating individual pots with paint and markers with pods of dirt and a packet of seeds into a beautiful exercise of planting these seeds into the soil and feeling nature in our hands and then taking our creations home to our families to let them grow and flourish. We thank Deby Cahan for her help with this activity. Our Hamantaschen baking evolved from forming these triangular and symbolic cookies into each student taking home many of these delicious treats home to their families. We thank Sharla for leading the baking as she always does in our school. In addition, all students donated tzedakah as part of the Purim tradition to give to others, with the help of synagogue's student rabbi Micah.

As this issue comes out, we will be in the midst of celebrating Passover with our students during our annual chocolate Seder. We will build small "houses" out of matzah to continue celebrating within an interactive activity. We will also have a family service that will take place during the holiday with potluck items for Passover and a service lead by our children and staff that commemorates the holiday with song and beautiful prayers.

We now have a newly established TSRS committee of clergy and presidents from both congregations, along with parents and myself. This team will work to insure that our school year is always supported by the community and to help plan events.

As three of our students have their B'nai Mitzvot this spring and summer, I find myself nostalgic for their younger years. Mattea, Lucy and Molly were all so young when I met them and I have seen them grow up and become independent and strong teens who are part of the backbone on our school. Teaching them in preparation for their services has been such an honor.

I am also excited to announce that I completed my Masters program at Gratz college for Jewish

instructional education with my last class, call Parashat Hashavua - Wrestling with the weekly Torah portion. I am so excited each TSRS session to bring the skills I have learned into the classroom setting. The last class has particularly prepared me for the wonderful conversation and discussions Rabbi Norm and I have with the B'nai Mitzvah students as we dig deep to get up the heart of their Torah portion and Haftorah to connect it to their own lives.

The next few months will see us turn from winter to spring and finally summer. Students will graduate, we will enroll new children and the cycle will occur again but right now I am focused on the present which means the next few delightful months of not only Passover but Israeli holidays, family services and our end of year party that celebrates the education and growth that occurred this year. I am reminded of the girls again, ready to celebrate their B'nai Mitzvah ceremonies while it feels like I just saw their smiling faces just a few minutes ago when they were so little. I remember Molly and Lucy coming for the first time to our school with their mom Leah and meeting them in the parking lot and also meeting a smiling Mattea, whose DNA is part of the Temple Beth El congregation as a fifth generation member. I am so blessed and honored to have met these children and all of the other wonderful students that come into our school. It is a gift to be able to watch and help them build their Jewish education, to teach and lead them on their way and to see them become wonderful people! Thank you to our community for giving me the gift of being their Religious School Director. It is a great privilege.
