All members should attend the congregational meeting on Sunday, July 30 at 7PM to vote on budget and leadership issues.


Save the date for Friday evening, August 18 for Kabbalat Shabbat at The Quarry House in combination with Temple Beth El with potluck dinner to follow.

CAMP SCHOLARSHIP

Dear Members and Friends,

Thanks to a generous commitment from Mike Pletman, young people from our community have an enhanced opportunity to attend summer camp or Israel program through a tuition grant from his foundation. Summer youth programs have been shown to have an outsized impact on the development of Jewish identity and appreciation for Jewish values among children and teens. Such programs can be especially valuable in communities such as ours where the predominant community exposures are non-Jewish.

Michael Pletman Charitable Foundation Scholarship for Jewish Children in the Warren County Area Towards Attending a Judaic Overnight Camp Experience

Since moving to Glens Falls, it has become increasingly important to me that opportunities exist for our youth members of the community to experience being in an environment living a Jewish experience where they are immersed in a Jewish culture and population.

Last day of this offer: October 1, 2023 Guidelines:

- 1. Camp must be American Camp Association accredited.
- 2. Camp must be one in which the camper and staff in bunks and learning situations (i.e., crafts, swimming, boating, everything) are Jewish. There will certainly be non-Jewish wonderful support staff from around the world in the kitchen and maintenance, and who are essential but not directly interacting with campers in bunks and activities where informal Jewish education occurs.
- 3. Camp must be clear in their mission of providing a Jewish experience formally and informally with programming, services, spirit, events and more, as opposed to "Jewishstyle." Camps such as Camp Ramah New England (conservative) and Crane Lake / Eisner (reform) and there are severely others such as Cohen Camps (3 camps owned by Cohen Foundation) and Young Judaea Camps and Moshava (orthodox) and many more that would fit the parameters.
- 4. The opportunity to make friendships with Jewish peers and staff from around the world is life-changing, especially when they might be one of a handful of Jewish children in their home community.
- 5. Must be a non-profit camp and contribution for camper is paid directly to the camp in the name of the camper's account. Israel experience would be included also.
- 6. If camper cancels while the camp allows for refund, the correct amount given by my foundation would come back to the foundation.
- 7. Up to total campership funding from Michael Pletman Foundation would be \$4,000 to be split among campers meeting above qualifications.

- 8. This is an offer that must be used for the 2024 camp season.
- 9. If interested, please reply to Katie at either office and she will contact Mike.
- 10. I would be happy to help families with locating possible camps and answering questions. Families might want to set up 2023 summer tours to see camp in action and get a feeling for the camp.
- 11. Applicants do not have to be affiliated directly with the temple or synagogue.
- 12. Many camps fill up quickly, with enrollments starting in August, thus the October 1 deadline.

Please note that some camps may have matching scholarships. They all have funds available to apply for as does the NE Jewish Federation in Albany to help fund Jewish camping and Israel experiences.

Even one person attending this type of camp experience would be life-changing for that person and our community.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF FAMILY OR FRIEND OF CONGREGATION SHAARAY TEFILA

Our Yankelovitch great-grandparents from Russia lived on Broad Street about 1905. Our grandparents lived in Granville, NY. My brother was named after our grandfather, Aaron Barney Yanklowitz who passed on May 23, 1947. Aaron was ring bearer in our sister's wedding (Feb. 1955) upstairs at the synagogue. Special memories were the birthday parties at our Aunt Libby and cousins Barbara and Sherrie Lvnn's home on Lexington Ave. & Bay and at Libby and Irving Levin's home off Sanford Street. Aaron graduated GFHS with friend Herb in 1967. He graduated from Adirondack Community College in 1969. My brother and I are the only siblings now in our family. I am very proud of him and would like to share some of his history beyond the years of Sunday & Hebrew School and Bar Mitzvah at Shaaray Tefila. He and his wife, Karen are very proud of their wonderful children and grandchildren. He enjoys traveling, gardening and much more.

Meet Dr. Yanklowitz (Barney)

The baby of seven born to first generation Lithuanian-Jewish-American parents and raised in a small, northern, upstate New York town (Glens Falls) nestled in the Adirondack mountains, Dr. Yanklowitz developed a strong work ethic tempered by an abiding compassionate nature. He received his BA from the State University College of New York at Potsdam in 1971 and his DPM degree (Doctor of Podiatric Medicine) from the Ohio College of Podiatric Medicine at Cleveland in 1975.

Barney retired as a Lt. Colonel (LTC 05) from the US Army after 20+ years of service as a podiatrist. He was the track team physician while assigned (1980-1983) at the US Military Academy at West Point, NY. Barney was the Chief of Podiatry Service at Walter Reed Army Medical Center (1984-1987). He was the Director of the Podiatric Surgical Residency training program at Tripler Army Medical Center in Honolulu for six years. He was the Consultant to the Office of the Surgeon General of the US Army for 6 years. In 1995 he received the Legion of Merit award which is the seventh highest award given by the US Army and he is the fifth Army podiatrist to receive this award since 1942.

His residency training was at the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio. He was board certified (1985-2017) of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons. He relocated to Steilacoom Puget Sound Health Care System (Seattle/American Lake) and Director, Podiatric Residency Training (1998-2011). From 1998 to 2012 he was appointed Adjunct Professor to the California School of Podiatric Medicine in Oakland, CA. In April 2002 his peers elected him "Distinguished Practitioner" into the National Academy of Practice. From 2012 to 2017 he was appointed Clinical Associate Professor of Podiatric Medicine and Surgery to the School of Podiatric Medicine at Western University of Health Sciences in Pomona, CA.

Barney retired again in 2017 and relocated with his wife, Karen, to Trilogy within Tehaleh in Bonney Lake, WA.
