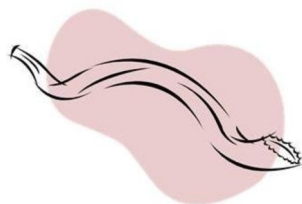
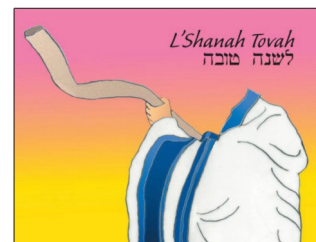

STUDENT RABBI NAFTALI HIRSCH

It is my absolute pleasure to introduce myself to you all. I look forward to being able to meet each of you in person at Shaaray Tefila this month and getting to know you over this coming year. I grew up near Toronto, Canada, engrossed in a small, vibrant, and *heimisch** Jewish community, and have spent much of my life pursuing, creating, and supporting this kind of Jewish life. I'm entering my final year of rabbinical school at Hebrew College where I have enjoyed studying the classic works of our tradition, as well as more mystical sources. In college, I studied history and philosophy at McGill University in Montreal, where I also worked in kitchens and as a snowboard instructor. When I'm not in *shul*, or pouring over books, I love to hike and spend time outdoors.

As many of you know, a couple of weeks ago we entered the month of *Elul* - אֱלוּל - with which we begin the custom of blowing the shofar each day. I don't know how many of you experience this, but when I close my eyes and open myself to hearing the blast of the shofar, it stirs something in me. This is the intention of the custom, to startle something inside us. (Try it out! – if you don't have a shofar to blow, you can turn up your sound and hear it here (tinyurl.com/TekiahBlast)). R Jacob b. Asher in explaining our custom quotes *Amos* (3:6), “If the shofar is blown in the city, will the people not be stirred / tremble?” (Tur, OC.581). The practice is meant to remind whoever has forgotten, that there are more generous perspectives to choose in any moment, broader than the ones we might be stuck in. In the words of the Rambam shofar is a call to “Wake up sleepy-ones from your slumber...[to] those [of us] who have forgotten [this] truth in the transience of time...” and to awaken us to return to those parts that wider perspective. (MT H.T.3:4)

This month, I want to invite you to take a moment each day, listen to the sound shofar [online] or find something else to shake things up a little and ask yourself, is there some part of myself I've lost track of this year, a moment in which I lost my way, or missed the mark, and can I take one step towards a return, a repair, as we move towards the start of a fresh new year?

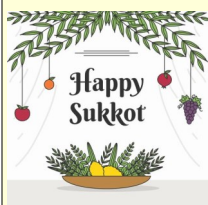

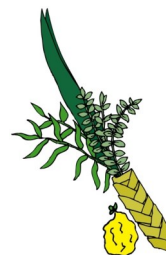

We studied Hebrew primarily with Sunny and Paul assisted some of us weekly for about a year.

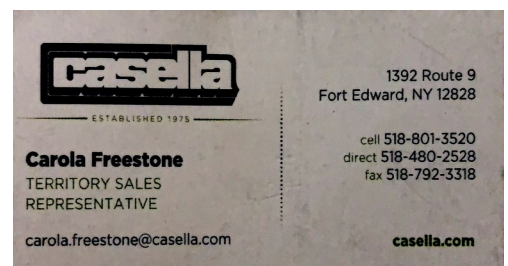
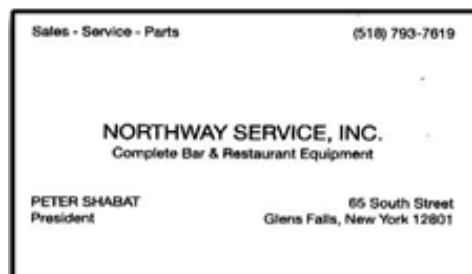
