As we read Parshat Bereishit together a few weeks ago, I shared the teaching of the *Netivot Shalom*

(the late S'lonimer Rebbe) that the first 14 weeks of our Torah cycle – from Creation through the giving of the Torah in Parshat Yitro – can be understood as the emotional and spiritual preparation for receiving the Torah and all of the opportunities-for-connection (mitzvot) that it provides. He divides these into two parts – those before our ancestor Avraham and those after, stating that the first set of Parshiot can offer us examples of how even small instances of rage, striving, and hubris can lead to doing real harm in the world. Within this frame, the stories of Abraham and our other ancestors can offer up examples of how to cultivate more admirable ways of being in the world, with particular ancestors being described as paradigms of one attribute or another. Avraham is the paradigm of *hesed* which contains the attribute of love within it. It bears naming, that our ancestors are not always models of perfect behavior – on the contrary, countless times through these stories they display a great deal of imperfection. And, personally, I'm very grateful for this. While at times it might feel as though we have models or expectations of perfection to live up to, no one is perfect – we wouldn't be human if we were – and that makes our ancestors' stories that much more relatable.

One manifestation of this attribute from Avraham is right at the beginning of Vayera, this month's first parsha. G-d appears to Avraham while he is sitting by Mamre forest healing from his recent surgery. Despite whatever physical pain he feels in recovery and even being in the presence of the Holy Blessed One, Avraham steps away from this Divine connection because he sees three passersby along the path. Avraham insists these travelers stop, welcoming them into his home, instructing Sarah and a household youth to prepare a feast for them. Avraham has every reason not to 'put himself out' like this, yet through his actions, and

while holding his own pain, he insists that serving others doesn't require 'putting aside' one's own needs. Instead, one's own needs can be served through moments of connection. This is what enables the Talmud in Shabbat (127a) to say "welcoming guests is greater than even receiving the Divine Presence."

There is so much pain in the Jewish world right now through this unfolding tragedy, however it may have continued by the time you read these words, with all of its spillover into each of our lives. Even without this happening, each of us has enough reasons not to 'go out of our way' for others, not to 'put aside' our own direction for them. And yet, finding a way to do *hesed*, for others can open up and deepen our own direction. May we each find the ways unique to us to bring truth to Psalm 69 יעולם הסד יבנה "May the world be built from *hesed*," truly, it is the only thing that can.

I would like to express my condolences to the families of Diane Alkes, Stephanie Kaufman, and Amy Jo Liberta who have passed in recent months.

Naftali Hirsch will be with us twice this month, during the weekends of November 3 and November 17. Please remember that when he is here, we will also be having Friday night services in addition to our weekly Saturday morning services. Note also that November 17 is a combined family service and potluck with Beth El to be held at Shaaray Tefila. It is a great opportunity to experience multi-generational

Jewish togetherness (even though children are welcome to **all** our services.)

By the time you read this, the situation on the ground in Israel may have changed considerably so what I have to say may or may not still be relevant. Although I rarely comment on the specifics of American or Israeli policy, I have seen what a deep impact recent events have had on the hearts and minds of our congregants. Beyond offering prayers and encouraging contributions to organizations that aid those who have suffered as a consequence of recent events, I offer the following observations:

- 1. Although many American and Israeli Jews have been frustrated by the direction of Israeli politics and society over the last few years, I am heartened that Israelis have put aside divisions to come together to face this external threat.
- 2. Although the scope of Hamas' recent attack was worse than innumerable prior terrorist attacks, the ruthlessness of the atrocities has many precedents in prior Palestinian terror attacks, such as those involving the murders of school children in Maalot and Kiryat Shemona, the murder of Israeli athletes in Munich, the kidnapping of Israeli civilians to Uganda, and many more attacks on Israeli civilians before and since.
- 3. There was a terrible intelligence, military and policing failure that led to the success of the Hamas attack. Once the immediate security crisis is over, there will need to be investigations to define the errors of omission or commission so these mistakes are not repeated.
- 4. I am reluctant to be an armchair quarterback from the safety of my home in Glens Falls, NY. It isn't my home or my family that is under threat. I also have no military expertise whatsoever. However, I do have many years of experience making life and death decisions in my medical career and would observe that sometimes there are no good options but we need to choose the least bad option. The choice should be based on carefully weighing the short-term and long-term risks and benefits and not be based on personal considerations and emotions of the political and military leadership, many of whom have been embarrassed by recent security failures.
- 5. There may be some lessons to be learned from prior problematic attempts to change

geopolitical realities by purely military means such as the U.S. interventions in Iraq and Afghanistan as well as some prior Israeli military actions that led to unintended consequences. Let's hope the Israeli leadership has carefully thought this through and has a realistic assessment of the pathway to the best possible outcome.

I hope and pray that Israel's leaders are guided by G-d's light and that the hands of those who defend Israel are strengthened and that the land is blessed with peace and its inhabitants with lasting joy.


