Last month during the *chagim*, we said the prayer of the ‘13 Attributes of G-d’s Compassion’ many times over, which is discussed in Talmud-Rosh Hashana (17b). Here G-d is said to have told Moshe that anytime the Jewish people make mistakes in the future, their path to *T’shuvah** will come through doing this prayer. Moshe Alshich, 15th C. Turkish sage, points out that it’s not “*saying*” – אמרו – this prayer that will bring *T’shuvah*, but – יעשו – “doing” or “enacting” it. What does it mean to ‘enact’ the 13 Attributes? To emulate the Divine Attributes described – to find ways of being compassionate, gracious, patient, overflowing in kindness and truth, and overwhelmingly generous. This is a tall order! How are we supposed to do this? Perhaps neither we, nor even G-d is expected to always be all of these things or all of the time. In this week’s *parsha***, *Vayera*, the scene opens with Abraham sitting outside his tent recovering a few days after his recent surgery. G-d appeared to [Abraham] by Mamre’s Pistacia trees — וַיֵּרָא אֵלָיו: ; – יְהוָה בְּאֵלֵינוּ מִמְּרָא וְהוּא יֹשֵׁב בְּפֶתַח הָאֵהָלָה כְּהֵם הַיּוֹם – he was sitting at the entrance of the tent as the day grew hot. (*Bereishit* 18:1). Talmud-Sotah (14b) asks our very question about this *pasuk*. *R. Hama b’R. Hanina* says: “What is the meaning of that which is written: You shall walk after יְקוֹק, your G-d (Devarim 13:5)? But isn’t it said, ‘that G-d is a consuming fire [how could one chase after this and live]’ וְהָלָא כְּבֵר בְּאֵמֶר “כִּי ה' אֵלֶיךָ אֵשׁ אֹכֶלֶת הוּא” Devarim 4:24) *R. Hanina* shares a number of places in the Torah where G-d acts out one of these attributes, including the verse above and explains “Just as the Holy One, Blessed be He, visits the sick [during Abraham’s recovery], so to you should visit the sick. -- הַקָּדוֹשׁ בְּרוּךְ הוּא בִּיקָר -- חולים...אף אֵתָה בִּיקָר חולים --

Even G-d, who the Thirteen Attributes is asking us to emulate, isn’t doing this all at once. The invitation from this month of holidays – of repeating this phrase over and over again – is rather to take just one step in a gentler, kinder,

more caring direction. And while the *chagim* do come all at once – and maybe alongside a rush of hoped-for changes – our tradition offers us these stories to look towards throughout the year, to digest piece by piece and maybe find a little inspiration at a slower pace. May we all find little moments to lean into the fuller versions of our selves through the end of this month of Cheshvan. Wishing you all a joyous rest of Sukkot, Simchat Torah, and Shemini Atzeret,

* Sometimes translated as forgiveness, *Tshuvah* comes from the root .ש.ב.ה for “turn” [as in, a change in our path forward] or “return” [as in, to our fuller selves]

"MESSAGES FROM SURVIVORS"



Crandall Public Library brings "Messages from Survivors," a powerful new exhibit about the Holocaust, survival and resiliency to our Library and the Glens Falls Region

Crandall Public Library presents The Memory Project Productions traveling exhibit panels, *Messages from Survivors: One Family's Holocaust Legacy*. The exhibit is built on 40 years of filming a family of Holocaust survivors in the Bronx, Miami and a bungalow colony in the Catskills between 1962 and 2016. The exhibit travels around the United States with a focus on rural communities who may not have the opportunity to interact with many Jewish people or visit Holocaust museums. The panels will be displayed through October 24, 2023 starting in the New & Popular Room and continuing throughout the First Floor. The exhibit is impaired accessible.

The Memory Project Productions grew out of the vision of painter Roz Jacobs, the daughter of two Holocaust survivors, and the experience of educator Laurie Weisman.

In the early 2000s Jacobs was toying with the idea of creating an exhibit that would provide viewers with an intimate view of a painter's experience. She tackled the project by creating multiple portraits using a photograph of her uncle Kalman as a subject. Kalman was the younger brother of Roz Jacobs' mother. Like the rest of her mother's family, Kalman had been killed during the Holocaust.

While working one day, Roz was startled by a tangible sense of this little boy standing in the photographer's studio looking up at the camera. Suddenly, a feeling of his life force replaced her haunting imaginings of how he might have died. She spent the next decade creating The Memory Project with partner Laurie Weisman in order to share this life-affirming experience of connecting with the past. Today, the internationally recognized Memory Project brings people inside the creative process while addressing themes of loss, love and resilience.


"STORIES OF EXILE"

Crandall Public Library to Hold "Stories of Exile" Reading Groups with Support from the Yiddish Book Center

Crandall Public Library is one of 29 national libraries selected to participate in the Yiddish Book Center's "Stories of Exile" Reading Groups for Public Libraries initiative this year.

"Stories of Exile" is a reading and discussion program to engage teens and adults in thinking about experiences of displacement, migration, and diaspora. In this program, librarians organize reading groups to discuss three books of Yiddish literature in translation, and one book related to the experience of a community served by their library.

In addition to the three works of Yiddish literature in translation, Crandall Public Library has selected excerpts from the novel *The Infinite Tide*, by Christian Kiefer. This last work focuses on a relationship between an isolated astronaut and an isolated Ukrainian exile.
