We've moved past Hanukah's darkest nights of the year, and as the days grow longer we begin to envision the spring's thaw. In the Shema's 2nd paragraph – וְהָיָה אִם שָׁמַרְתָּ (Devarim 11:13-21) our tradition speaks to the shifting seasons. In the preceding *pasukim* (11:10-12), Moshe tells our ancestors how different their environment will be in *Eretz Yisrael* from being in *Mitzrayim*. In Egypt, one simply kicked open an irrigation channel to flood the fields with the Nile-water. In the Holy Land, if the Heavens don't open, the fields will simply be dry. This is more than an agricultural question, throughout the book of Devarim, rain is understood as a sign of G-d's blessings of abundance.

The Shema's 2nd paragraph is often read as a support for a theology of Divine reward and punishment. If the people listen to and follow G-d's *mitzvot*, then G-d will reward them with rains and abundance, or else. However, as Dr Reuven Kimelman teaches, this doesn't accord with the ways this kind of 'If-Then' statement would be written in the Torah. Rather, it should be read to say 'since there will be times when the people are close to G-d's word and when there are rains and abundance, in those times, they must take care not to take this goodness for granted and stray from their spiritual path.' Which is to say, a life of comfort can tempt putting down spiritual tools; when things go well, it is harder to access spiritual

practice. Yet without these tools, life will be harder, especially if that abundance also disappears. What then? 'Then we can turn back to those same spiritual tools we'd put down.' And what are we told is the reward for using these practices? That it will feel like we have more time – "your days will be lengthened."

In this same text, we read of ancient Eretz-Yisrael's two sets of rainy-seasons – the early rains (*Yoreh* - יוֹרֵה, falling from after Sukkot until Hanukah and the late rains (*Malkosh* - מִלְּקוֹשׁ, falling from Purim until Pesah. In each period there may be abundance or scarcity. We know that this year, the first of these periods was a very hard time. Approaching the month of *Shvat* (Jan 11-Feb 9 '24), we are now between those two seasons. We don't know yet what things will be like by the time the late-rains should come. For our ancestors, this in-between was when the tree budded and sap began to flow, when they hoped and prayed anew for the coming year's abundance. *Tu biShvat* (Jan 25) is the holiday that marks this new hope. Let us gather together and direct ourselves to the spiritual tools that will help us hold the hard times we've experienced, as we hope for more ease, and continue to build the resiliency to move through whatever comes.

I found these minutes on one of Harrie' Bobbin's notepads as I was sorting Sisterhood history. The secretary was unable to attend. Harrie was secretary for the CST Board so a pro with taking notes.

(In 2000, Harrie & Sunny asked me to help with Sisterhood. I was co-President with Harrie then President starting 2002. I did child care in Lake George then started to substitute teach and could not continue the position by 2004. Dolly became President then we were co-presidents. By 2011, Harrie was President again.)

These notes are from Sisterhood Meeting May 17, 2011.

Welcome

Shirley Kanofsky, Chaplain for our opening prayer

This will be a very short meeting as there will be a Yiddish class starting. We are honoring Shirley tonight for being our chaplain for 30 years. She has not only been our chaplain but also made weekly visits to the hospital and sent out all types of cards to mark special events and wishing get

well to our members. Shirley took care of the Sunshine Fund for 30 years also. She has been an invaluable asset to not only our Sisterhood but to the Synagogue as a whole.

Shirley is the ideal example of the difference one person can make for the good of many people.

Tonight we are going to show the video, made by David Schwartz, of Shirley being honored in January by the Synagogue-Temple Religious School for her many years of devotion teaching Hebrew school.

Before we see the video, we must have a short business meeting which will begin now.

First and foremost let me say here in the year 2011, people do not care to attend meetings. For this reason we have cut our meetings to 2 per year with programs such as movies or speakers sponsored by us in between.

Second of all, due to the many responsibilities all of our members deal with in today's world our main goals have changed.

We, thanks to Leonore Lebowitz have a beautiful and varied gift shop. [Joan Charisse & Dolly continued the gift shop, possibly Laurie, secretary for many years then Nancy & Francine- now Nancy Goldstein.]

Thanks to Shirley, we maintain touch with our members and friends by her sending out many cards and visiting patients in the hospital.

Our main source of income which goes to the Synagogue comes from the gift shop and primarily from the Onegs and Kiddushes as we prepare weekly.

If not for the incredible job Bonnie Yanklowitz and Dolly Chary do by shopping for the best food and beverage bargains and plus our yearly dues of \$18 per member, our bank account would be nonexistent.

Finally, we come to the actual preparation of these Onegs and Kiddushes which includes the food preparation, setting the tables, making sure we have two challahs each week and wine and grape juice. This has basically come down to Bonnie, Dolly and myself.

We have always had Onegs and Kiddushes but with the arrival of Rabbi Elliott and Ilana Marmon due to Elana's influence, our kiddush changed from a very basic repast to a full-blown luncheon with the addition of salads and large variety of desserts.

I will be the first to say that this is a wonderful thing. Our people attending services then sit down together to enjoy good food, fellowship and the pleasure of praying (benching) afterward.

We have never been short of sponsors – our members who so generously supplied the money to afford the food and for this we are extremely grateful. Also, one of our special members-Eleanor Elliott who makes and bakes many of our most sought after kugels and an amazing variety of baked wonders – but due to that & Bonnie's shopping skills and Dolly's work we have a present balance of \$742 in our Sisterhood account - one president, myself, who has been an active member of sisterhood for 53 years and president non-consecutively for 15 or 20 years but who's counting?

I never thought the day would come when I could no longer carry on but my friends that day is here.

I know there are most of you who would not want to see the Sisterhood become a memory so I am appealing to you to step forward and take up where I am leaving off. It can be one or more than one to take over what has become a much more simplified job as the years have gone by.

I do love this organization that I have invested so many years in. I've made and kept and unfortunately lost some of my dearest friends here.

I am not disappearing and will help anyone who can see how valuable we are to continue but I can no longer keep this office.

I would like to now open the floor for nominations for a President. (Joan Weill, Bonnie Yanklowitz)

As we move into 2024, our Hebrew School has seen some great months from the fall and early winter – and we have so much to look forward to! As always, we closed the end of the first semester by participating in Temple's Annual Latke Fest. months to come. We are strong in our pledge to give each of our students knowledge and love of the Jewish homeland.

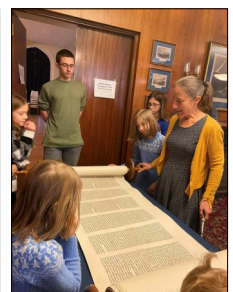
I will end with a Prayer for the State of Israel found in the Mishkan T'filah for Youth:

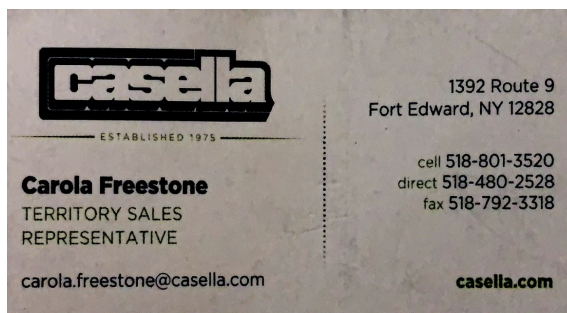
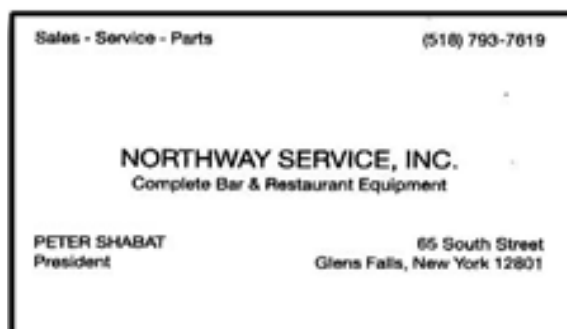
