SHEVAT-ADAR I 5784

We've turned the corner, past Ḥanukah's darkest night of the year, and while snow still glistens on the ground of Glens Falls, our ancestors

were looking hopefully up at the trees - whose buds began to form on Tu biShvat (the 15th of the Hebrew month of *Sh'vat*). Maybe you took the opportunity to celebrate with a feast of some [dried] fruits, nuts, and grape juice or wine following the 16th Century Kabbalistic practice.

There is a lesser known set of kabbalistic practices for this time of year in communities like ours, which don't presume we live amongst the orchards of Spain, Morocco, and Tzfat, where pomegranates, citrus, or grapes grow into the darkest months. These are the practices of - בקשות Bakashot and - שובבים Shovavim. Bakashot began around the time of the Spanish expulsion (1492) CE) and really expanded amongst these same 16th Century Kabbalists. For communities all around the Mediterranean, the practice was one of singing piyutim (liturgical poetry) from the middle of the night into the dawn through each Shabbat of the Yamei Geshem - 'days of rain' from Simchat Torah until Pesah. It continues today, especially in centers like Istanbul, Ashdod, Montreal, and Jerusalem. Beautiful melodies accompany the piyutim and build through magic of these early hours, while cups of coffee or tea are passed out amongst the rows, all culminating in Shacharit prayers around dawn.

The practice of *Shovavim* circles more narrowly around this very time with its name being an acronym of the Torah portions of these 6 weeks: Shmot - ,סמור, יפשלים. 'Beshalaḥ - ,הימשפטים. Yitro - ימשלות, ימוחל Mishpatim - בשלח, During this time Kabbalists would fast from dawn until dusk on Thursdays and often Mondays, in order to focus more intently on their own actions and past mistakes. Indeed the word Shovavim means trouble-makers. There are also practices to remain

silent, fasting from speech, on Shabbat – except for words of prayer and Torah.

While many of us may not be looking for excuses to come to shul in the middle of the night or bring more fast-days into our ritual, I think these mystical practices continue to hold sway for so many because of the power there can be in coming together during the darkest times. The physical darkness may have been more weighty in the time before electricity lit up our long winter nights, yet this winter and many others bring cause for heavier hearts. Our tradition acknowledges this and these practices offer opportunities to look inward, individually, and to come together inside of ritual and community when shadows loom large. May we all find a little more solace inside of silence and comfort through poetry and song this month.


