Hi all. I am so excited to be visiting the first weekend of December to join Shaaray Tefila in song and schmooze.

Even as I write this, during this month of Black Friday, the holiday season is already among us. Our Christian friends are dusting off their lights, setting up resplendent trees, and buying gifts for their loved ones. Meanwhile, we are anxiously awaiting Chanukkah, which coincidentally starts on the night of December 25th.

Why do we even celebrate Chanukkah? It's not in Tanach and the book of Maccabees is only preserved in the Greek Christian Bible. It's about the rededication of a building that no longer exists. In fact, some Jews stopped celebrating it all together!

מַעֲשֶׂה וְגָזְרוּ תַּעֲנִית בַּחֲנוּכָּה בְּלוֹד, וְיָרַד רַבִּי אֱלִיעֶזֶר וְרָחַץ, וְרַבִּי יְהוֹשֻׁעַ וְסִיפֵּר. וְאָמְרוּ לָהֶם: צְאוּ וְהִתְעַנּוּ עַל מַה שָׁהָתִענִּיתַם.

There was an incident and the Sages decreed a fast in Lod. Rabbi Eliezer descended and bathed and Rabbi Yehoshua cut his hair. They [Rabbi Eliezer and Rabbi Yehoshua] said to them [the Sages] go and fast for what you have fasted for. (Talmud Bavli, Rosh Hashanah 18b)

This situation is a little obtuse so let me fill in some gaps. Fasting is forbidden on Chanukkah. Not only did the rabbis of Lod stop celebrating Chanukkah but they also fasted, violating a rabbinic decree! Rabbi Eliezer and Rabbi Yehoshua are dissenting voices, they perform actions that show they did not accept the fast. Rabbis Eliezer and Yehoshua rebuke the rabbis of Lod and tell them to fast for their sin of fasting. It gets a little confusing here.

We all know who wins the debate. Despite the Temple being destroyed, we continue to celebrate Chanukkah. Why? Some rabbis suggest that there is the mitzvah of candle lighting, others say the miracle is too well known.

I want to offer a third option. I think we continue to celebrate because we are a people of hope. We long for the Messiah. We aspire to rebuild the Temple. Much like the oil, our hope continues to burn bright.

Despite centuries of violent oppression and trauma, the Jewish people continue to not only survive, but thrive. Chanukkah serves as a reminder, a symbol of our people's resilience.

My wish for you all this holiday season is that we may continue to cultivate hope. I am not saying that it is necessary to suppress sadness, to deny despair. Despair comes. It is a natural human emotion, especially as our days get shorter and darker. When you feel despair, remember that there is light in every darkness, it is possible to hope for a brighter future.


