SHEVAT 5785

RABBINIC INTERN DAVID MAGAZINE MALAMUD

Hi all! I can't wait to visit you twice in the upcoming month, on the Shabbat starting on February 7 and February 28.

In this month, we celebrate Tu Bishvat, the new year for the trees. In college, my friend Nathan always had a new hobby. One year, after Sukkot, when everyone collects etrogim to make liquor or jams, Nathan collected over 300 etrogim to grow etrogs. We all doubted he could do it, but he turned his dorm closet into a grow room and by Tu Bishvat, he had an etrog for everyone at Hillel. I took three of those etrogim, and while two perished, one has survived for almost a decade. I pray often for this tree of mine, my most cherished house plant.

In an excerpt of a prayer for the trees, the 19th century Rabbi Yosef Hayyim poetically writes in the Leshon Hakhamim:

הוּא ראש הַשְּׁנָה. אָנָא יְהֹוָה הוֹשִׁיעָה־נָא הַיּוֹם הַזָּה לָאִילָן הוּא ראש הַשְּׁנָה. Lord, please save us on this day; for the trees is it the new year.

. אָנָא יְהֹנָה הַצְּלִיחָה־נָא הַיּוֹם הַנָּה לָאִילָן הוּא רֹאשׁ הַשְּׁנָה Lord, please grant us success on this day; for the trees is it the new year.

אָנָא יְהֹוָה הַרְוִיחָה־נָא הַּיּוֹם הַזֶּה לָאִילָן הוּא רֹאשׁ הַשְּׁנָה. Lord, please grant us relief on this day; for the trees is it the new year.

אָנָא יְהֹוָה הֵטִיבָה־נָא הַיּוֹם הַנָּה לָאִילָן הוּא רֹאִשׁ הַשֶּׁנָה. Lord, please grant us goodness on this day; for the trees is it the new year.

This prayer improvises on the climatic prayer of Hallel, our ritualized recitation of certain Psalms reserved for major holidays. Tu Bishvat is not one of these holidays. While Tu Bishvat makes sense in, אַרץ ישראל, the land of Israel, the timing does not make any sense in a North American climate. Tu Bishvat is less than a month away and today I played with my dog and kids in our biggest

snowstorm of the season. And yet, something about this timing makes sense to me.

Like Rosh Hodesh, the new month does not start at the fullness of the moon, but rather at its absence. So too, in Boston and certainly in Glens Falls, the new year of the trees does not start in the warmth of spring or the flowering of summer, but in the cold of winter. At the moment of the moon's darkness and the year's frigidity, we need the promise of rebirth and renewal more than anything.

And Rabbi Yosef Hayyim's prayer speaks to this aspiration for renewal. We pray for this renewal to come to us.

There were times that I thought my etrog was a goner. She battled several rounds of spider mites. She began to flower a couple years ago and then lost all of her buds and leaves. I watered an empty pot for months and, lo and behold, it sprung back to life. My etrog is now a couple feet tall again and shooting off new growth left and right.

The trees have a strength, a wisdom, a resilience. My prayer for us is that in the dead of winter, we can embrace Tu Bishvat's promise of renewal. Like my etrog, we may feel defeated, beaten down. May we be like the trees, with deep roots, that can weather any storm, grow from our mistakes and blossom.

Shalom from the cold, snowy North Country.

While we are dealing with the challenges of winter, our friends and family in Israel are getting ready to celebrate Tu B'Shevat, the New Year of the Trees. On the 15th day of the Hebrew month of Shevat, on the night of the full moon, we celebrate the New Year for the tithing of the fruit of the trees. Trees must be three years old or older before we can take their fruit but how do we determine a tree's age without cutting it down and counting their rings? The rabbis came up with a practical solution, picking the 15th of Shevat to be the birthday of all trees.

Tu B'Shevat marks the season in which the earliest -blooming trees in the Land of Israel emerge from their winter sleep and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle. While we in Northeast New York State are shoveling white snow, in Israel they are admiring the fragrant white blossoms of the almond trees. It is a time of anticipation for the springtime soon arriving.

In the 16th century, the Kabbalists of Tzfat compiled a Tu B'Shvat seder, somewhat similar to the seder for Passover. It involves enjoying the seven species native to the Land of Israel; figs, dates, pomegranates, olives, grapes (or raisins), honey, wheat and barley (in the form of bread, cake or cereal). We eat various nuts with shells (walnuts, almonds, pistachios, coconut) and fruits with peels (oranges, pomegranates, avocado). We also eat fruits with edible seeds (blueberries) and other fruits with inedible pits (peaches, plums). We drink four glasses of wine or grape juice (white, blush, pink and red). The First Cup is pure white, the Second Cup is pale pink (white with a drop of red wine), the Third Cup is darker pink (with more red added) and the Fourth Cup is almost totally red (with only a drop of white).

The seder is a great way to appreciate the bounty that we so often take for granted and to enjoy the company of our friends. It's a time for introspection and spiritual growth. It's a time to appreciate the many gifts we receive from our trees such as fruits, lumber, shelter, shade and the very air we breathe. Sisterhood hopes you will be able to join members of Temple Beth El at the temple to share a Tu B'Shevat Seder on Thursday, February 13th at 6:15 pm, to celebrate the New Year of the Trees. Your participation makes the celebration of our holidays even more special.

All are welcome to our Saturday morning services to share in beautiful prayers and interesting Torah studies. Also delicious Kiddushes! Our Rabbinic Intern David Malamud will be conducting Shabbat services on some Friday nights and Saturday mornings each month. Please try to attend and show him our support on the weekend of February 7 and February 28.
