Hodesh tov and an early Hag Purim

Sameach!

I hope everyone has faired well in this snowy weather. I look forward to seeing you all on this Shabbat, the Rosh Hodesh of Adar. When I taught Hebrew School, the rabbi of the shul would always dress up as Hester Panim. This is a really nerdy Talmud pun: "Hester Panim," to turn one's face is likened to Esther. This is also a theological concept. After the destruction of the Second Temple, G-d turns his face and hides from us. This concept explains G-d's apparent absence from the world. Megillat Esther is a prime example of this; G-d is never mentioned.

My teacher, Rabbi Nehemia Polen, brings the first Hasidic anthology, the *Keter Shem Tov*, a collection of the teachings of Rabbi Israel Ben Elazar, the Ba'al Shem Tov. The Ba'al Shem Tov, the BeShT for short, begins with the statement, "the end or the goal of knowledge is that we should not know." My teacher Rabbi Polen explains, "The goal of knowledge is the realization that we don't know, that we won't know, perhaps we should not know." This idea is as old traced back to Socrates who is said to have concluded that "I know that I know nothing."

The Ba'al Shem Tov connects this idea to the service of G-d. He gives a parable about a King in a palace. You are invited to tour the palace. You can see every part of the palace, the library, the study, you may even see the King's wardrobe or meet members of the royal family. But you will never meet the King. Some people are distraught by this idea. Why bother to go on a tour if you can't meet the King? Others might say, let me get as far as I can. That aphorism is not enough for the BeShT. The BeShT says that the difference between these two people is not being on the path of service to G-d and being on the path of service to G-d. This aphorism reflects a time of Hester

Panim, where G-d can be sought after, but never found.

We live in a time of Hester Panim. How can we comfort ourselves in a time where God is hiding from us, never to be found? Hasids often liken our search for G-d as a son's search for his father.

My kids love the book *Llama Llama Red Pajama*. For those of you who are not experts in children's literature, this is a going to bed book. Mama Llama puts Baby Llama to bed and Baby Llama freaks out. One of my favorite pages is the climax of Baby Llama's spiraling. "Llama Llama red pajama, in the dark without his mama, eyes wide open, covers drawn, what if Mama Llama's gone?" I remember reading this to my kids once and Ben looked at me with a look of true fear. Baby Llama screams and Mama Llama returns. Mama Llama reassures Baby Llama, "Mama Llama's always near, even if she's not right here."

The last time I read this book, I realized it is the perfect metaphor for our relationship with Hashem in a time of Hester Panim. Abba Llama is always near, even if he's not right here. We cannot perceive Hashem, but even so, we can sense that his presence is near.

This Adar, leading up to Purim, I want us to try being on the path of service to G-d. Even though we cannot perceive him, that doesn't mean he is not nearby. Hashem may simply be giving us the independence we need to grow up. That doesn't mean it is not scary. It is. In these times of uncertainty and change, it is easy to despair. It is easy to ask, "where is G-d?" When you find yourself doing so, as I am sure you will, consider Abba Llama is always near, even if he's not right here.

As a teenager, Dolly enjoyed riding and spinning under a horse as it was running. Her daughter Bunny shared that her mother loved trick riding. Dolly played tennis, piano, loved gardening and NY Times Crossword puzzles. She was a voracious reader.

In '95 she opened Chester Veterinary Hospital at Bonnie Belle Farm in Chestertown. Dolly and Louis became members of Congregation Shaaray Tefila. A few years later, sadly Louis passed away.

A year later Dolly met Robert Morrissey. Special friend, Father Michael Abraham officiated the wedding in '98.

Dolly continued Hebrew & Torah studies with new friends Cher & Judy in Glens Falls at CST. Dolly made many friends at the Synagogue and Temple Beth El.

She taught Sunday School for the Temple-Synagogue Religious School and Hebrew School. Dolly was also on the TSRS Board. She was very involved with many projects and committees at the synagogue in the community. Elana Marmon had started a wonderful Outreach program and Dolly was on the committee. When Elana and Rabbi Marmon (of blessed memory) moved to Israel, Dolly continued the Rosh Hashanah Flower and the Purim

(Mishloach Manot) Projects. She worked on the Vilna, Lithuania Cemetery Project and invited Dr. Michael Lozman for a program at the Synagogue.

Scott Schwartz and Dolly organized picnics at Haviland's Cove and Crandall Park for the Synagogue, Temple and community with help from the Jewish Federation Of Northeastern New York and donations from committee members and participants.



In between winters in Florida, traveling with Bob and volunteer work for committees and projects, Dolly donated countless hours of veterinary care to Adirondack Save-a-Stray and the community. She also worked on starting a Veterinary Studies Program at SUNY Adirondack.

Dolly and Bonnie co-chaired the Art, Craft and Raffle Fair with Cher, Francine, Dr. Alan Korot, Dr. Bill Brender, Claire Kantrowitz (in blessed memory), Karri and others assisting or selling their works [or creations]. Kaye, Kristi and family, Faye and many others helped with the Sisterhood garage sale. Dolly had many more shul, Temple and community friends – too numerous to list and also continue to visit friends who had moved to FL- Rose Rothstein, Hilda Schwartz (of blessed memory) and Judy Aronson and Libby Levine.

Dolly and Bob did much with families and friends. Her knitting, crocheting and rug hooking were gifts to many. They traveled to Vilna (Lithuania), St. Petersburg, Russia and to HI and trips to Bob's naval reunions in CA and MD. Unfortunately, with health issues Bob passed in 2014.

About 2016, Dolly moved from the Lion Country Safari winter home and her NYS home to Brookdale Independent in Lake Worth, FL. Dolly loved her apartment, new friends and exercise classes with Marie. 
