Sameach!

I hope we are all staying warm in our slow march to spring. I look forward to seeing you all on the Shabbat preceding the first days of Passover and for the first days of Passover. My kids, Ari and Ben, and my wife, Rebecca, will be joining me on this longer stay. I'm so excited to introduce them to our community.

Now that Purim is past us, I'm sure many of us have already moved onto preparing for Passover. I want to address the elephant in the room. Passover can be a very stressful holiday. Whether you are meticulously cleaning the house of hametz, crafting the best menu for Seder, picking out a new Haggadah (reach out for suggestions!), or planning travel to friends and family, we toil over this holiday which commemorates our liberation from Egyptian slavery.

At its core, technically, Passover symbolizes the transference of Am Yisrael from Egyptian servitude to divine Servitude. And yet, our haggadot speak of Herut, freedom. In the Haggadah, the Ha Lachma Anya, "This is the bread of affliction," concludes

הָשֵׁתָּא עַרְדֵי, לְשֶׁנָה הַבָּאָה בְּנֵי חוֹרִין. This year we are slaves, next year we will be free.

Wait a minute, I thought the Haggadah talks about freedom? Or, aren't we forever under the yoke of Heaven? I think Ha Lachma Anya summarizes the Haggadah's and the rabbis approach to this question. The rabbis, born out of sectarian division during a time of hyper-partisanship, recognized that This World, Olam Hazeh, is not a world of freedom. Sound familiar?

The rabbis recognize that while we are free from Egyptian bondage, we are not free from the demands of our world. The rabbis dreamed of Olam Haba, the World to Come, that would be like a second Eden. This is what the rabbis have in mind when they say "we will be free."

So, does G-d free us from Olam Hazeh as he freed us from Egyptian bondage? I'd argue no. Today, I had the pleasure of hoping on Zoom and witnessing a Brit Bat for a baby girl. The mother shared in her remarks a Kabbalistic notion, hitorrerut shel matta and hitorrerut shel maala. In response to Hester Panim, G-d hiding his face, a concept I wrote about last month, the Kabbalists argued that G-d is only aroused to action by the actions of humanity, not vice versa. So, nu, how do we inspire G-d to free us once and for all and bring us to Olam Haba.

Rav Kook, the first Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi of Jerusalem and the founder of religious Zionism connects the symbols of Passover: freedom and biur hametz, the burning away of hametz before the holiday. Kook argues that freedom only comes through biur hametz, "excision of anything and everything that delays liberation from our midst. This is the 'leaven in the dough' whose damage is particularly felt at the time when the light of geula/ liberation is shining upon us."

Now I'm not saying that literal biur hametz isn't valuable. I know that I personally need the Jewish calendar to force me to do spring cleaning. However, when these rituals and holidays become a form of enslavement, we have lost the meaning of the holiday. I invite you to take a step back. Take a breath. Focus on your connections to family, to the tradition. This is what Passover is about.

99-YEAR-OLD HUDSON FALLS NATIVE REMEMBERS CONGREGATION SHAARAY TEFILA IN THE 1930S

It's not true that Marian Frost Sussna was born the year Edison invented the light bulb.

It was not until October, 1925 that Mrs. Sussna, who now lives in Manhattan, was born in Hudson Falls.

Mrs. Sussna, now widowed, probably is the oldest living graduate of the Congregation Shaaray Tefila's once active teen girls sorority.

We had several long conversations recently with the energetic Mrs. Sussna, and she reflected on her long ago days growing up in Hudson Falls and attending Congregation Shaaray Tefila. Q-You were brought up in Hudson Falls? Tell us about your family.

A- I was born in 1925 in Hudson Falls and was the youngest of 5. I am the only one alive now. My dad owned a store in Hudson Falls called Frost Department Store for 35 years and it probably would have been longer, but he passed away at only 56.

Q - Were there other Jewish families in Hudson Falls that you would interact with, or were your Jewish connections mainly in Glens Falls? *A*- Other than my siblings, I was the only Jewish student in school until the end, when a couple of Jewish doctors moved in with very small children. The Jewish kids I knew were mainly in the Shaaray Tefila sorority My folks were somewhat observant and kept a Kosher home. They went to Shul for the High Holy Days and my mom lit candles on Friday night, but I do not recall religion ever being a topic of conversation.

Q-It is long ago now, but, as you remember, were there good relations between Jews and Christians in Glens Falls in those days?

A- As I mentioned, all my friends growing up in Hudson Falls were not Jewish, and I only remember one antisemitic remark that was a bit annoying. The boy involved did not finish high school so he probably did not know any better. And, on the plus side, the Catholic priest in Hudson Falls said prayers in his church in honor of my father.

Q-What can you tell us about congregation life as you knew it growing up? Services? Other Congregation families?

A-My parents Morris and Celia Frost belonged to the shul for many years and I and other members of *my family went to services there. It was a long time* ago (1930s), but I do remember a few things. We would go to the High Holy Day Services, but young people couldn't sit still that long so we kids would go out on the porch for stretches of time and talk. In those days coming from Hudson Falls, our family once or twice stayed overnight at a rooming house near the synagogue at Yom Kippur. The sorority was for teens and a few post high school kids were involved with the activities which were all at the synagogue. Probably 10-15 girls were involved at any one time. I do remember one embarrassing moment – at an initiation ceremony for the sorority, we were all supposed to sing "God Bless America" and everything went fine, but one girl could not carry a tune and had to sing it more than once to get it right. She had guts to do it over in front of the others. One other moment stands out: when I was

much, much younger at Yom Kippur services with my parents, I remember running down the aisle at the services amusing people with a chicken leg.

Q-When did you leave Glens Falls and where did you go?

A-I left Hudson Falls in 1943 after high school, went to Ohio State for a year, then transferred and finished at SUNY in Albany. I later got an MA at Columbia Teachers College and taught at NYC Community College in Brooklyn Heights.

Q-Can you tell us about your husband, your children?

A-I met my husband, Steve Sussna, at the Community College, where he was teaching while going to Fordham Law School at night. I taught high school math for many years, and Steve was a city planning and zoning consultant. In his last career, he was a full professor in the Baruch College law department in New York. We were married for 59 years when he passed away at 89. We have two children, Alan, now in Arizona, and Amy, outside of Chicago. We have been blessed with four beautiful and well-educated grandchildren.

Q- Where did you live most of the time after Glens Falls?

A-We lived most of our married life in Lawrenceville, New Jersey and belonged to Princeton Jewish Center, where Alan had his Bar Mitzvah, and later Brothers of Israel in Trenton, NJ., where Amy had her Bat Mitzvah and then became confirmed. In 2000, Steve and I retired to New York City, where I still live.

Q-What activities – including religious ones – do you pursue now?

A-My friends and I try to get together for a few holidays each year at someone's home and we order in a traditional holiday meal.
